#### THE RECTOR WRITES

I suppose that the most significant news item this last week has been the announcement from Camp David that President Sadat and Prime Minister Begin have reached some measure of agreement over the future plans to defuse the situation in the Middle East, and the make it possible for there to be peace between Israelis and Arabs. This may all seem very far away from us in peaceful Norfolk, but this is far from the truth, for it is by no means impossible that a major war in that part of the world could easily escalate into the unthinkable World War 3.

So it is very much in our interests to do what we can to see that these peace initiatives do not fail, even if we have no higher motives.

But surely there is little that we can do, for it is remarkably unlikely that our opinions will cut much ice in international decisions.

And yet, are we so sure that we are powerless? At the outset of the Camp David Meeting, the three men concerned, all deeply religious men, a Muslim, a Jew and a Christian, issued a joint appeal to all people of whatever Faith to pray for them, that they might be guided to make the right decisions: this was a unique request, men of different faiths and opposing views asking jointly for help and guidance. And may it not be that some part of the reason that against all odds they magaged to find a way forward was because they were upheld by a great wave of prayer from many people?

Already their agreement has come under fire from many quarters, as was to be expected, and extremists on both sides will do all they can to wreck the proposals.

All the more reason, therefore, for all who believe in the power of prayer, Christian, Jew, Muslim of any others, to continue to use this powerful weapon: if we do not pray for them because we just can't be bothered, then we will have to share in the blame if war should come.
