THE RECTOR WRITES

"ell, its come at last, the date of the long-expected election, and, whatever people's political views, I am sure that we are all glad, because what is needed so badly now is that one or other of the parties shall have a clear mandate from the Electors of this country to govern firmly.

During these next five weeks we will all probably get heartily sick of the endless propaganda which will come to us via the television and the media, but I very much hope that we will listen to as much of it as we can stomach, and above all that we will listen with care to the views put over by the politicians belonging to parties other than our own, assuming that we are firm supporters of one particular party, and not 'floating voters': and incidentally, there's nothing wrong with being a floating voter, for it means, at its best, that you are genuinely ready to listen with care, and to make your own decision when it comes to the point of voting, on the basis of what you have heard, casting your vote for the party which you really believe will best serve the interests of the whole nation.

We do not yet know how many Candidates will be standing in our own Constituency: 1944, we had no less than 4, representing the Conservative (Paul Hawkins), Labour(Henry Toch) Liberal (Paul Nash) and Independent Powellite (Mrs.McNee), which certainly gave us a wide choice. I hope very much that once we know who they are, I will be able to persuade each to write a single page for The Reeve's Tale, giving them a chance to put their points of view briefly and clearly for the benefit of those of us who are unable to get over to wherever they are speaking to hear them in the flesh, so to speak: for with an enormous geographical area, it is clearly impossible for all of them to get to all the smaller villages.

But, come what may, the most important thing is that on May 3rd. we should all vote, for this is our democratic right, and if we do not, through indifference or laziness, then we have no right to criticise whatever Government we get.

HEATHER DAVIS aged 31

The vast crowd, estimated at about 330, who gathered in Foxley Church on the afternoon of Sunday, March 18th. for the funeral of Heather Davis who died on 15th. March, spoke eloquently of the affection and respect in which she was held by the great number of people who knew and loved her. The Parish Church had been loaned for the purpose, as it was very clear that the expected crowd would not be able to fit into the Methodist Church. The Service was conducted by the Reverend Neville Morton, the Minister from North Walsham, himself a life-long friend of both of Heather's parents, and he was assisted by the Rector.

Heather had borne her long illness with the most wonderful courage, and it was a mark of the affection in which she was held by the Staff of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital, where she had spend so many of the months of this last year, that barely a day went by in the last weeks when one or other of the did not ring up to find out how she was.

On her milk round she always had a cheery smile and a greeting

for her customers, and many people have spoken of how she had a real care for the elderly and the housebound, going far beyond her duties to see that they were not in any need which she could meet, and always ready to do little errands for them.

It was good that at the end she was ble to be at home, and the last weeks were a time of contentment and of real happiness, as she was nursed devotedly by her mother and other close friends.

The Collection at the Service, for Cancer Research, amounted to £391, and we understand that many additional contributions are still coming in, and that something over £600 has so far been received: we hope to give a final figure at a later date.

Our deepest sympathy goes out to Joan and Norman her parents, and to Paul and Annette, her brother and sister-in-Law, and to all the others who loved her.

But her sadly short life was a triumph, and she now rests in peace.
