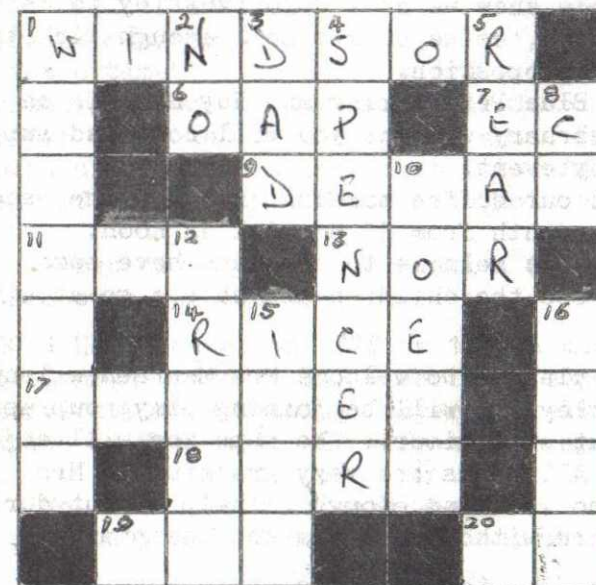

## A NEW SERVICE PATTERN FOR BAWDESWELL AND FOXLEY

" Well I must say, I think that you've attempted the impossible - to please all of the people all of the time". So said, very kindly, one of the members of one of the Parochial Church Councils after we looked at and talked about the revised plan of services which comes into effect at the end of this month - March 29th Mothering Sunday.

First of all some explanation of the abbreviations used over the leaf :-

HC = Holy Communion, BCP or 1662 = the 1662 Book of Common Prayer; III = Series 3 modern language service; MP = Morning Prayer (sometimes also known as Mattins); EP = Evening Prayer.

Now let's look at each week.

1st Sunday = 0830 Holy Communion, Prayer Book exactly as now.  
0945 Holy Communion, Series III, similar to now.  
1100 Foxley Methodists United - a new go at a formerly tried venture. Anglicans in Foxley Please turn up at the Methodist Chapel.

2nd Sunday = 0830 Holy Communion as now.  
0945 Family Service without Communion. This Service will be Modern language, concentrated on the children and contain modern songs hymns, etc., often led by the guitar and will last only 40mins. As time goes on I hope children will lead prayers take readings, take the offertory and generally find a real welcome place in the Church.

1100 Morning Prayer - abbreviated, but with hymns and sermon, followed by

1145 Holy Communion, abbreviated with a hymn to round things off. These two services will operate as a whole unit, although there

..... will be a definite break at around 11.45 to allow people to go and come if they so desire.

This pair of services is intentionally designed for Prayer Book Communion lovers who are not able to be there at 8.30am. Please support this service if this your cup of tea.

3rd Sunday - All services exactly as at present.

4th Sunday - 0830 as at present.

0945 Family Service as at Bawdeswell - see 2nd Sunday. Also Mrs Hale is going to encourage her Methodist Sunday School children, (and Parents) to come along to the Church and will not have her Sunday School in the afternoon - as a further drawing together of our two denominations locally. (I hope by the time you read this that the C/E General Synod will have made definite moves in the unity field nationally). Also, Margaret Flint, the Foxley Youth Club Leader, hopes to be able to come along and encourage her young people to come. (in case you didn't know, this is a Christian based Youth Club which operates at Foxley Village Hall on Tuesday evenings.)

1100 Morning Prayer &

1145 Holy Communion - as 2nd Sunday.

5th Sunday - 1030 Joint Family Service normally Series III Holy Communion (although not as it happens on its very first day of operations - Mothering Sunday).

This service in May, August and November will operate similarly to the HC Family Services that have been happening up to now, with some traditional music, some modern, children's oriented talk etc. but with Communion for the adults and a blessing for those not confirmed or not in full membership

Two supplementaries:- With the new service pattern we shall, like our fellow Deanery Churches of the Pilgrim group adopt a variation on the lectionary, where only the Holy Communion set readings are followed. This should minimise the repetition of readings.

Secondly the Family Services at 0945 on the 2nd and 4th Sundays, will become the normal place for the incorporation of Baptisms from now on.

It always has been the policy of the Church of England that Baptisms should be public events, and we shall all be able to join in the joy of such events and truly seek to welcome new people and babies. I quote from the book of Common Prayer:-

"The people are to be admonished that it is most convenient that Baptisms should not be administered, but upon Sundays, and other Holy Days, when the most number of people come together."

and the Alternative Service Book says, "Holy Baptism is normally administered by the Parish Priest, in the course of public worship on a Sunday....."

I hope that this will help parents really feel part of the Church Family by being there when there are other youngsters around and that the monthly service in either village, where noise and clatter is not going to matter will help them to be able to carry out their promises to attend Church and bring up children in the knowledge of the Faith.

I hope this clarifies the concepts behind the pattern. Please telephone if I can help with any further explanations.
