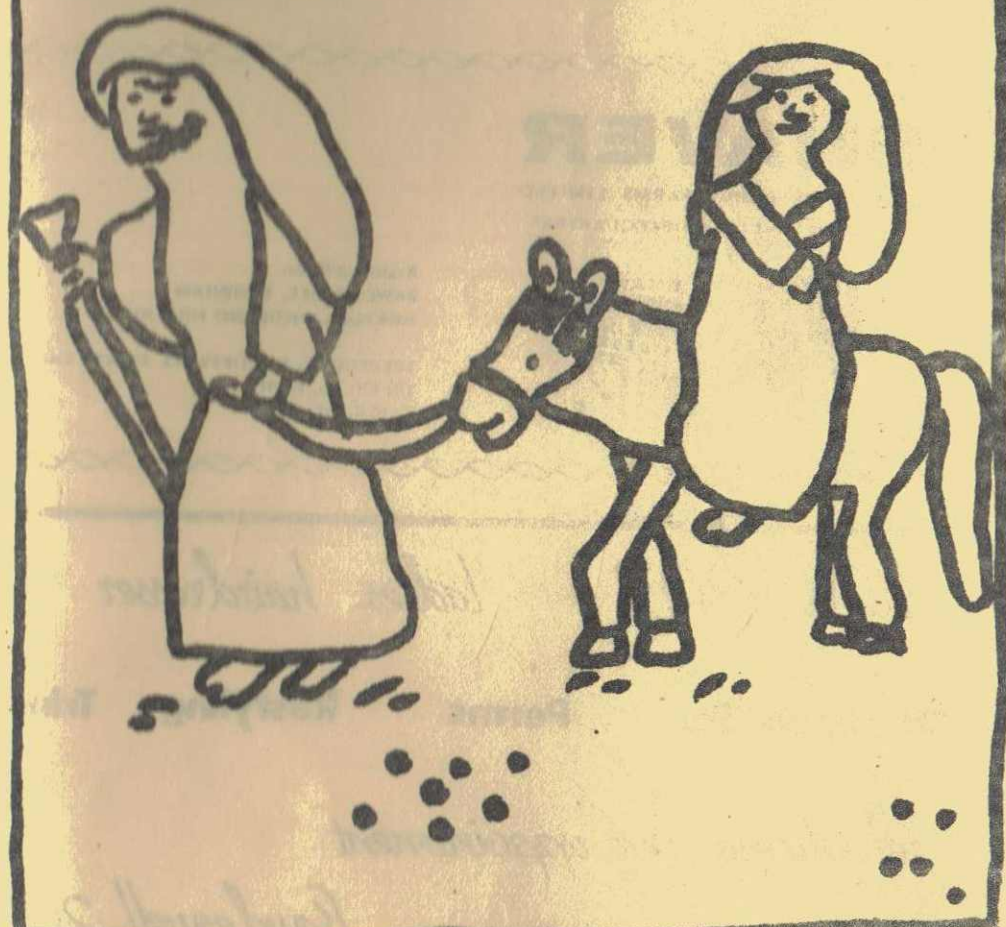

Bennetts Corner

I am writing this in the 3rd week in November for our Christmas Issue and while the winter is not yet on us I have taken the advantage of the mild days to get the garden cleaned up. The strong winds have whipped up the leaves and heaped them in the corners so its been easy to collect them up and put on the compost heap. I've sprinkled a little GAROTTA on them to assist rotting and I'll have some good compost to dig in later. Before it gets too cold sharpen up the secateurs and shears and cut back the perennials and shrubs. Don't be too drastic with the roses just cut back old flowering stems and whippy growths.

Any time now you can prune your fruit trees, cut out misplaced branches from the middle of the trees, cut back new shoots to 3 to 5 buds that is 1½ to 2 ins and these short ends will make fruiting spurs next year. Fruit bushes will have to be cut back to encourage the fruit buds to develop. Push some of the cuttings in the ground about 4 to 5 ins deep and many of them will have rooted by next Autumn. You can also do this with semi hard wood cuttings of shrubs.

Wherever you put them don't dig them up before the Autumn or they may die. A few potted Strawberry Runners could provide some early fruits in the greenhouse. After they have fruited place them outside and keep for next year, 2 year plants in pots can provide a lot of fruit.

The next thing of course is fruit tree spraying with tar oil, choose a calm day and make sure to spray round the base of the tree where the bugs hide in the winter. Clean out the greenhouse and wash down with Jeyes fluid and fork over the soil and sprinkle Bromophos to kill soil pests. If you potted up any bulbs and they are still outside bring them inside, give them as much light as possible and plenty of water. Its not too late to plant bulbs in the garden. We still have plenty to choose from.

Bennetts Corner - continued

By now you should be picking brussell Sprouts, usually, by this time we have had frosts which should improve the flavour but I'm glad we hav'nt because I'm still picking runner beans, today I picked 4lbs, thanks to my late sowings. Many of my Brussels have been blown over so I have supported them with a couple of canes, this also applies to Purple Sprouting Broccoli, make sure they're tied up before the snow come.

November and December are the best months to plant trees, both fruit trees and ornamental trees. Cox's and Laxtons have always been the most popular varieties to grow, but this year SPARTAN has taken the award for the 'APPLE OF THE YEAR' its a lovely dark red apple and very sweet.

Flowering Cherries and Crab apples trees make fine ornamental trees for your garden and the latter will help with the pollination of the fruit trees.

Well Christmas is not far off and while we may not be in the mood for much gardening, please give a thought for those less fortunate and unable to do very much, a helping hand to trim the hedge, tidy the front garden or sweep up the leaves will probably be appreciated.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
