

ROBIN BROOKES WINS BBC RADIO AWARD.

Congradulations to Robin on winning the top award for the best religious programme on Local Radio - with his production of 'Walsingham', This programme, broadcast on the 28th November, was judged best of 93 entries for the awards made by the Sandford St. Martin trust.

The judges were radio critices from the leading newspapers, leading clergy and they were chaired by Mr Gerard Mansell, former deputy director - general of the BBC. G. A. EGMONE
