


"Jesus Christ - This Is Your Life.

That was the title of one part of the recent youth event at a Church in LongStratton to the South of Norwich. Young people playing the well known characters in Jesus' life spoke of what they felt about Jesus, what He had meant to them, the way things had not quite turned out as they expected. A child was once asked "What would you do if Jesus walked in the door? He replied "I'd hand him a Bible and say 'Jesus Christ, This is your Life'. A True statement....The whole of the Old Testament points towards the coming of the Messiah. The New Testament begins with his life, death and ressurrection, carries on to the beginning of the infant Church, the rest of His-Storey points backto him. The world was and still is changed by Jesus.

Election of officials for period 1982/83 resulted in the re-election of John Ames as Chairman and Robert Dewing as Vice-Chairman.


