

One date for your calender - a Barn Dance will be held in the Village Hall on Saturday 16th July. Watch out for the posters !


Produce Show


Owing to the bad weather conditions, the Produce Show is postponed until August the 6th.

FULEY PARISH COUNCIL.

The Annual Gerreral Meeting was held on Tuesday 24th. May 1983.in the village fall.

The retiring Chairmar, Mr.D. Webster, opened this his last meeting and thanked all those who had helped him fulfil the office, especially Mrs Janet Hatley, Breckland D.C. representative, and Mr.C. Sparkes, the Parish Clerk.

As there is still one vacancy to fill, it was decided to leave the election of a Chairman until the next meeting to be held on the 28th.June 1983.

Mr. Keith Murrell officiated as Chairman for the meeting. Matters raised during the meeting:

- 1. <u>Gypsies</u>. This problem still exists and it was suggested by the Chairman that a representative of the Gypsy Association be invited to attend a Parish meeting.
- 2. Drainage and Sewerage. Mrs.Hatley stated this was not aBreckland L.C. matter but that of the Anglian Water Authority, and thought it would be some time before anything would be done, due to so many schemes already scheduled.
- 3. Finance. The Clerk presented the Balance Sheet for the period 1982/83; he said that all documents had been through the Judit Check with no observations. Fresent financial state: Parish Council A/C £41.65. Village Hall A/C £109.15
- 4. <u>Coucil Members</u>. Mr.Arthony Cook, Mrs. Margaret Joice, Mr.Keith Murrell and Mr.Richard Farfitt.

BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL

The newly elected Councillors met for the Annual General Meeting on Monday 16th.May 1983. Councillors are - Mr.John Ames,Mrs Irene Ames,Mrs Olive Curtis, Mr. Peter Kane,Mr.Tony Smith and Mr. Victor Ward,with one vacancy to be filled. The Council then elected Mr. Peter Kane as Chairman for 1983/84.

Main items covered during the meeting were:

- Report by Mrs.Janet Hatley on Breckland District Coucil activities;
- 2. Amenities Committee Fund. Mr.D.Ryder attended and advised that as at January 25th.1983 £1837.65 was in deposit account, and £56.41 in current account held for the fund. He stated that the question of recreational facilities for the village had been fully investigated with local land owners. Land was not available.If members of the Parish would like to reconstitute a further committee the present members would be pleased either to join in or hand over to the new format.It was felt, however, that the fund should be kept intact for the original purpose.

It was finally decided by the Chairman that the subject be put on the agenda for the next meeting to be held on Monday 20th June 1983.

- 3. Lottery Licence. The Council has obtained this facility for the benefit of both villages.Organisations should contact the Clerk.The waste paper fund has supplied the £20.00 to obtain the licence, and a donation will be required from the users of the scheme.
- 4. <u>Bus Shelters</u>. The weather is still one of the main obstacles to overcome, but Mr. Ward assures the task will be commenced as soon as possible.
- 5. Fouling of Footpaths. Parishoners are requested to prevent their dogs from fouling footpaths and pavements; it is still a £20. offence. It was also reported that horses were being allowed to do the same thing.Parishions please take more care of your pets and friends.
- 6. Sunday School Mr. AEglington, whohas retired, but spent his early days in Bawdeswell, commented on the vast improvement in the village during this period. He regretted, however, that there is not now a Sunday School for the children, andhoped it would be possible for one to be formed - he would would willingly help as much as possible.
- 7. Parish Election. Momination papers for the vacant seat on both Bawdeswell and Foxley Parish Councils are now available form the Clerk. The official notice to this affect has been posted in both villages.Election, if necessary, would take place on Thursday 23rd. June.
- 8. Lorries in the Village.Complaints were recieved about heavy lorries in the village and egg van loading and unloading at the hazardous Bell Corner.


