Bawdeswell Parish Council

The main items dealt with at the 19th September meeting, which was held in Peter Kane's house due to a misunderstanding on Hall bookings. Two parishioners attended.

Bus Shelter; Progress has been quite good - One is almost complete. A request for a timetable from the Eastern Counties National Bus Company was made, and one will be provided, but they do stress the fact that the item is expensive and vandalism has been a problem at Bawdeswell. We are trying to help everyone in the village and in return a watchful eye to ensure the facilities provided are properly used will be a great help.

Amenities: Awaiting replies to letters sent to landowners.

Planning: 3/83/1109 Site adjoining the Post Office.

4 detached dwellings and garages.

Farish Council observations:- Considered that 4 dwellings are too many for the site, which were our previous comments. Access into the Street also very dangerous. The type of Dwellings unsuited for a conservation area.

Footpath Sign: Sigh in Jott's Lane which apparently has been either taken or knocked down and laid in the grass verge, Further enquiries to be made.

Highways Traffic Signs: Letter has been sent to the Highways Department with outline map showing suggested re-sitings and an acknowledgement has been received. The illuminated bodlard in front of the Mace shop was reported to be in a dangerous statedard Highways should repair this in the next few days.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be on Monday 17th October at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, when we hope to have a representative of the District Council predent to answer questions on Council finances.

Foxlay Parish Council

Water Levels: Highways Authority have been consulted again concerning the drains passing under the By-Pass, and they have confirmed that the task will be undertaken this Autumn and could even start in October 1983.

Planning: 3/83/1000 P. Bennett. Erection of House and Garage. P.C. observations, No objection.

3/83/1046 Floranova Ltd. Office facilities and Seed Store. P.C. observations, Pleased to see a development which could bring employment locally.

3/83/1052 P. Bennett. Caravan for night attendant. P.C. observations, It would appear that for security reasons this is necessary.

Parish Hall: Work is coming along - not so fast as one would like, but dealing with unskilled helpers must be accepted. The Halls new floor has been relaid, and the Hall redecorated - there are a few more jobs to be done and the committee would welcome a few more helpers.

Traffic Road Signs: A plan is to be drawn up by Councillor K. Murrell and when ready will be forwarded to the Highways Authority.

It would appear that I misunderstood, or perhaps heard more than I should have done, in regards to the two items reported in the September issuee- concerning the moter cycle noise and siting of the caravan. Sorry if I've hurt anyone's feelings, but reporting can be a rather trying task, especially when snippets are coming from more than one quarter during the meeting.
