## TOLLGATE HOUSE (see front cover)

Tollgate House, Norwich Road, Bawdeswell was built around 1823 when a Turnpike Act set up the toll route from Norwich to Fakenham managed by trustees for the public. There would have been a gate across the road outside the house for the toll-keeper to control traffic and collect tolls. Charges, such as 10d per score of cattle, 3d for a coach and 4d for a wain, went towards the upkeep of the road.

Before this turnpike route there was no main road from Bawdeswell to Guist and coaches had to travel via North Elmham. Carey's Coaching Itineraries, of the early 19th century, (kindly shown to me by Mr. and Mrs. Vince) show that coaches through Bawdeswell came from, or went to, Dereham, Aylsham, Norwich, King's Lynn and Foulsham, stopping at villages along those routes.
