GOOD NEWS!

At long last the village has acquired land for the use of all. We were successful at auction and have purchased the land down the Reepham Road. This is the first stage in realizing our goal for a village social and recreation centre.

Now is the time to return your pledges. We need as much as we possibly can before 14th May. Every £5 you give in interest-free loans means less interest to pay the bank and more chance to develop the land for use. To date, we have received £325 - our target is £3.500. It can be cone.

There has been some confusion about what the pledge means. Let me explain. You lend the village what you can afford for a minimum of 2 years. After this period, we promise to pay back to the lenders a minimum of £50 per month in £5 units. For example:-

If you loan £40, you will receive 8 unique numbers. These numbers will be put into a monthly draw with everyone elses numbers and a minimum of 10 numbers will be drawn out each month and these units will be repaid.

There will shortly be a public meeting which you are asked to attend. This is your recreational centre and it is up to you to decide what you want and how you can help to bring it about. Lets have your ideas. Look out for notice of the meeting in our local shops, etc.

Lets hope that by a concerted effort we can have an amenity to be proud of.

### TI LANTERN and ITS HISTORY

We are indebted to Mrs A.E. Lloyd Lewis for the loan of the Lantern and to Stephanie Ricketts for so kindly drawing such a life-like sketch of it.

The Lantern is copper with horn lights and was originally used in the sack barn of henry Green, New Walsingham (the old disused Slipper Chapel). He also owned Manor Farm at Sparham, which passed to his son Harry in 1920. The Lantern was given to harry Green's nephew, George Lloyd Lewis, who moved to Chancer house, Mrs Lloyd Lewis wishes her late husbands Lantern to remain in safe custody at all Saints Church, Bawdeswell with the Muniment Chest which her husband made from the remains of Church timbers after its destruction during the war.

The home of the lantern - the Slipper Chapel, was built in 1380, it fell into disrepair in 15,8. On August 11th, 1934, it was declared to be the national shrine of Our Lady of walsingham by Cardinal Dourne who led the first post Reformation pilarimage to the Shrine.

This year, August 19th 1984, is the Golden Jubilee Day of the restoration of walsingnam shrine, which is within the 14th Century Slipper Chapel. The Lady of the Manor, Richeldis de Saverches, was inspired through a vision of the Virgin Mary to build a small Saxon house to represent the Holy house of Nazareth, where Mary was asked by the Archangel Gabriel to become the Mother of God. The name Slipper Chapel, means the place where pilgrims prepare to walk barefool for the final mile, It could also be the Anglo-Saxon work "Slyppe" meaning wayside chapel. The Slipper Chapel is the only standing link with the original shrine.
