THE FOXLEY CHURCH TOWER APPEAL

The church tower is about 20 metres high and all the top half needs urgent attention. This includes the flintwork on all four sides, the lead roof, the copings, the finials and the pinnacles.

The Parochial Church Council has set an interim target of £5,000 for the Appeal Committee to achieve. This amount will enable repair work to commence early in 1985. The total cost of the work has yet to be assessed but will certainly exceed £20,000. The Council hope to raise most of the money by grants but the parishioners themselves will have to find at least a quarter of it.

The Appeal Committee is therefore arranging several fund-raising events and the first of these is on:

Saturday, October 20 at 7.30pm at Church Farm, Foxley, by kind permission of Mr and Mrs Charles Skinner. "A Silver Evening" presented by Nigel Dimmer, a Cheltenham jeweller and noted authority on silver. After the talk and demonstration, there will be a buffet supper with wine, to be followed by an auction of silver, or similar items, to be conducted by Kenny Ewing. Proceeds from the sale of items to be divided 50/50 between the donor and the Appeal. There will also be a chance to hear how people can themselves help to raise money for the Appeal.

Admission £3.50 by ticket only, available from the Rector, Charles Skinner or Martin Chase.

The next event will be a coffee morning and sale of Christmas Crafts at the home of Mr and Mrs Richard Parfitt on Saturday, December 1 at 10.30am.
