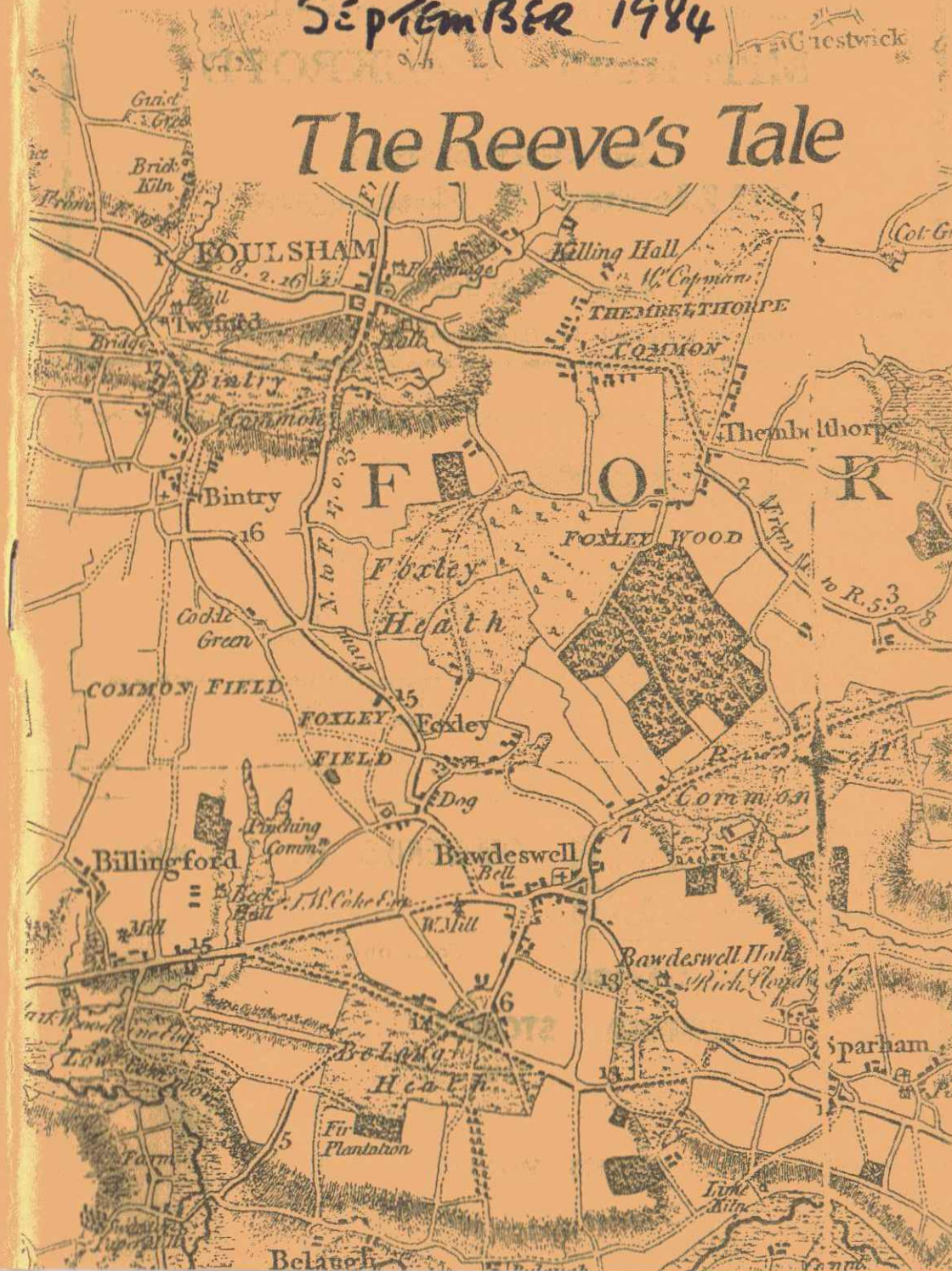

Responding to need was an attitude clearly demonstrated at the end of July. Like many, we saw the harrowing pictures on television of the Ethiopian Famine and its effects, particularly upon the children. Having found from past experience that the Christian Relief Organisation, TEAR FUND, can be relied upon to bring practical aid, working as it does through Christians in the disaster area, I contacted them and found that money could be channelled through them to relieve the famine in the Eritrea area of Ethiopia. Through a hastily arranged coffee morning and retiring collections at both Foxley and Bawdeswell Churches, a cheque for £157 was sent off to TEAR FUND. In thanking everyone who so generously responded, I am reminded that our contribution can only go a very small way to help and that responsibility for those in need, whether near or far, should be an on-going commitment.
