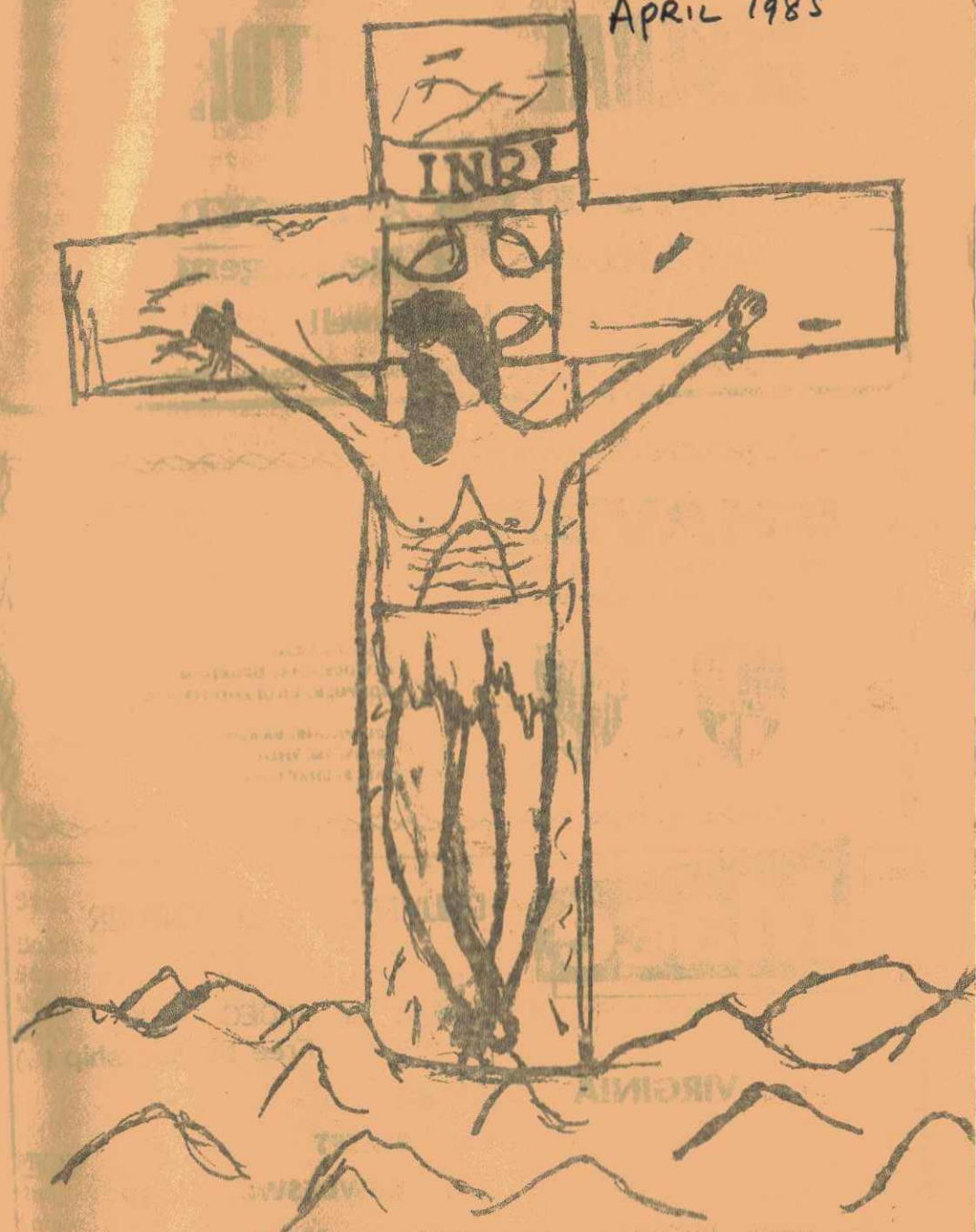

But perhaps it was doubting Thomas' response, when one week later he met with the Risen Christ that can best express our response to him - "My Lord and My God".

May our worship this Easter capture the joy and vitality of our faith in the Living Lord so that Easter Joy will be ours continuously.

A meeting of Bawdeswell Heath Trustees Fuel Allotment Trust was held on March 15th 1985.

Donations from Horse Riders' Permits amounted to £60 (Permits are £5 each or £10 for Riding Schools). RAF S wanton Morley donated £50 for their Scouts and Cadets who use the Heath. With investment income, the total income for the year was £164.30. Expenditure last year was £6.88 for Rates, £7.10 for Drainage, £25 Insurance and £38 for Charity.

The Trust rules state that the first call on income is Heath maintenance. The committee decided that this year, as more drainage and hedging was needed, no charity distribution would take place.

Concern was expressed about rubbish being dumped - all villagers are asked to keep a sharp look out and to note down the car number of anyone seen dumping rubbish - please report to the police or Heath secretary, Mr Robert Eglington, Park Farm, Bawdeswell.

The police have spoken to the motorcyclists who were trespassing on the Heath. No motorcycles are allowed on the Heath. If anyone sees the offenders, please report as above. In fact no cars or motorcycles are allowed beyond the stream.

Shooting rights have been let this year.

Dogs must be kept under control.

It is hoped that the Heath will remain in a pleasant place for villagers to enjoy - please do not abuse it.

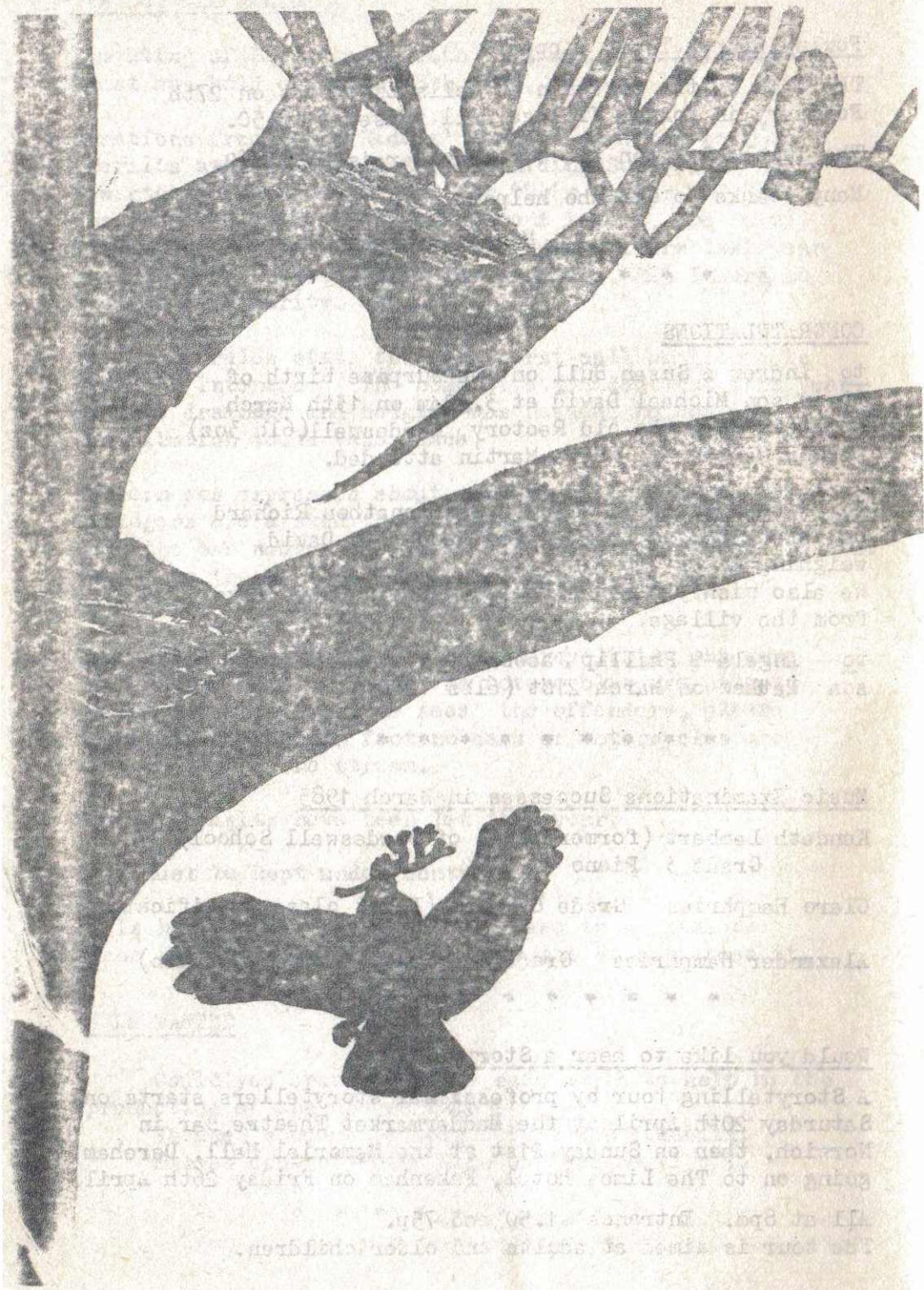
