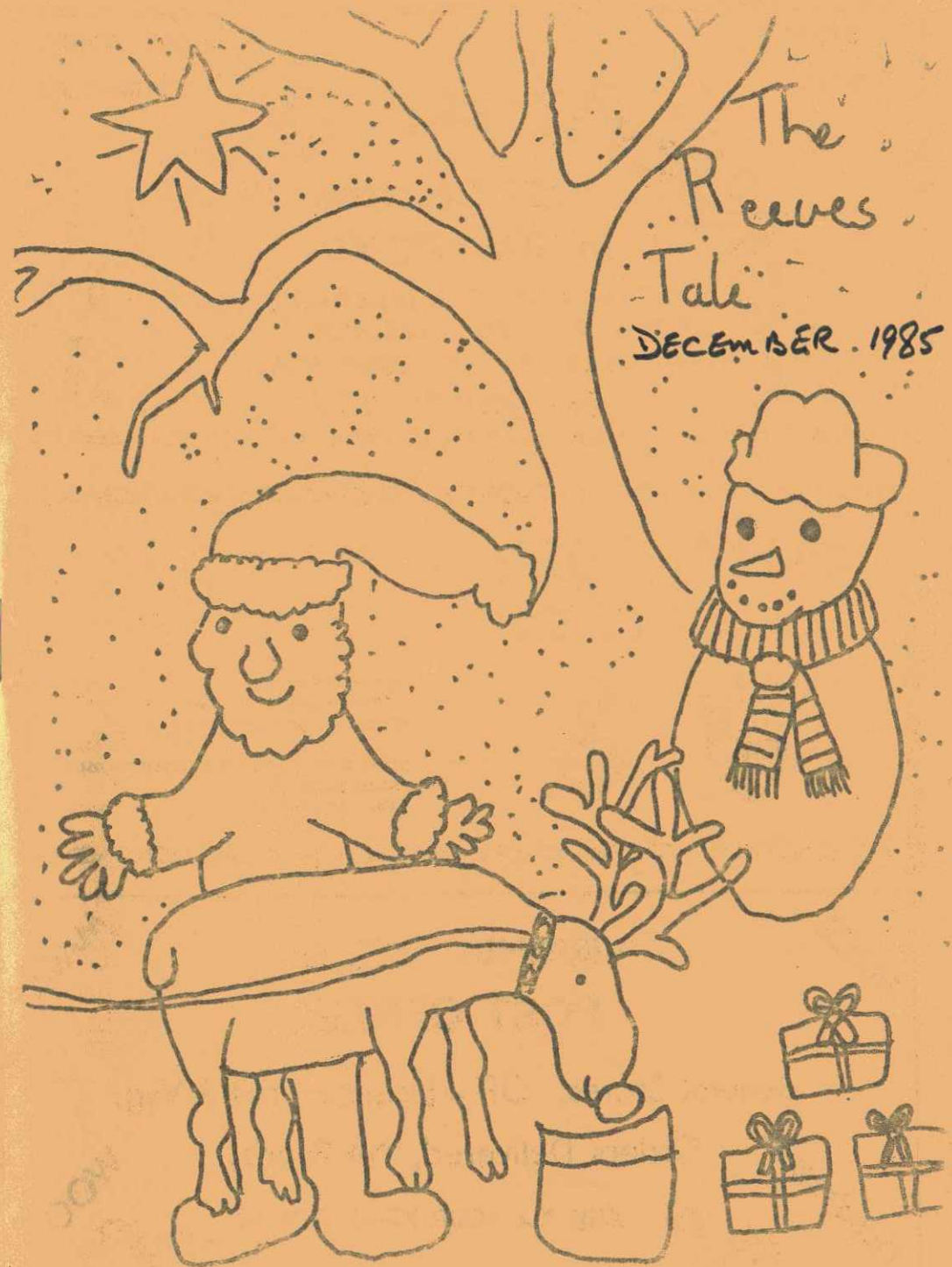

Dear Friends,

At the time of writing to you I am busy preparing three younger members of the Christian Family for confirmation and, like them, I am looking forward very much to the Deanery Confirmation Service which is being held at Bawdeswell on 28 November. As we've been thinking and talking together about confirmation, we've been reminded that it is very much a signing-on parade, when someone who has accepted Jesus as their Lord and Saviour, nail their colours to the mast for him and commit themselves to active service. How many of you reading through Reeves Tale have been confirmed? Probably quite a high percentage I would imagine, and yet for many of us, the ideal of confirmation comes far short of our own practice.

Thankfully, we needn't feel we're in a hopeless situation, that we've let Jesus down and there is nothing we can do about it. The Christmas Gospel from the first chapter of St. John reminds us "that to as many as received Him (Christ), God has given them the power to become his children" And that power is always available to us, even if we seem to have drifted away from our personal commitment at the time of our own confirmation.

The Church's year starts at Advent (1 December) when we begin to prepare ourselves for the annual celebration of Christ's first coming and to renew our commitment to him in readiness for his final return. Why not make Advent and the joyful Worship of Christmas the time for re-dedicating your lives to God and his service and enter again into fellowship with those who have been confirmed into full membership of Christ's Body, the Church?

There will be a warm welcome awaiting you at the special services during the Christmas season. After the 10.30 a.m. Carol Service at Foxley Church on Sunday 22 December, we hope you can stay for coffee and mince pies. One slight change will be made in the service times from 1 December through to the end of March next year when, on those Sundays when there is an early service at Foxley, the 9.00 am service will be at 9.30 a.m. No change to Bawdeswell Service times.

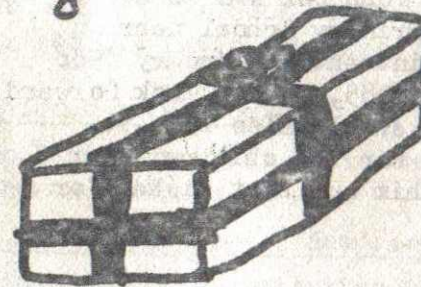

1. Old Surveyors Land (a) Reepham Road No volunteers to date to clear trees and bushes from site. Any one interested should contact any of the Parish Councillors for final arrangements.

2. Tree Planting Volunteers are needed to carry out the planting of Seven trees within the Village. Suggested time was subject to weather conditions, Saturday 23rd November at 2pm and starting at Primary School corner.

3. Police Parish Liaison Officer A correction must be made to October's information concerning appointment of a new liaison officer. 4. Highways The foot paths Fakenham Road will be inspected by the working party during their next visit to the village. Road signs for Dereham and Reepham Roads are still under consideration.

The new Headmaster appointed is Mr. John Cox who is at present Headmaster of East Barsham Primary School near Fakenham. He will take up his appointment in January 1986 on Mr. Pynes retirement in December 1985, and we look forward to welcoming him to the School. We should also like to thank Mr. Pyne for all he has done for the children over the past seven years, and we offer him our best wishes for a happy retirement.
