Main items considered at the meeting

Highways: Old Surveyors Land A Notice giving 21 days in which observations may be raised with the Charity Commissioners has been posted within the Parish. After this period final transfer will take place from District to Parish Council.

Clearing of trees from Reepham Road site to be undertaken in conjunction with use of machinery on playing fields. Tree planting in the Autumn alongside highway within parish to be arranged with Highways Authority.

Recreation Centre It was agreed to transfer a further £750 from Parish Accounts to offset a portion of the outstanding overdraft with the Bank. Tenders are requested for provision of six feet high chain link fencing to enclose adjoining properties.

Audit Accounts of Parish and Recreation Centre have been submitted for, and returned after, Audit with no adverse comments or observations from the Auditors.

Re-Numbering of Houses On a majority opinion it was decided no action would be taken by the Council on this matter. This would be the last time additional building would be possible to affect Folland Court and Paradise Road, and present suggested re-numbering will help postal deliveries and visits by doctors, etc. However, the Chairman stated he disagreed and would be sending a personal letter supporting tenants' views.

Village Guide Detailed information for the re-publication of the much out of date Village Guide is now available, but the cost of paper etc. could not be covered out of the Reeve's Tale accounts. Ways and means of covering this commitment were discussed and finally it was decided to grant £15.00 from Parish accounts.

Foot Path Sign A request will be submitted to the Highways Authority to site "Caution - No Foot Path" signs in Reepham and Dereham Road built-up areas.

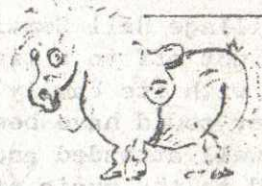
