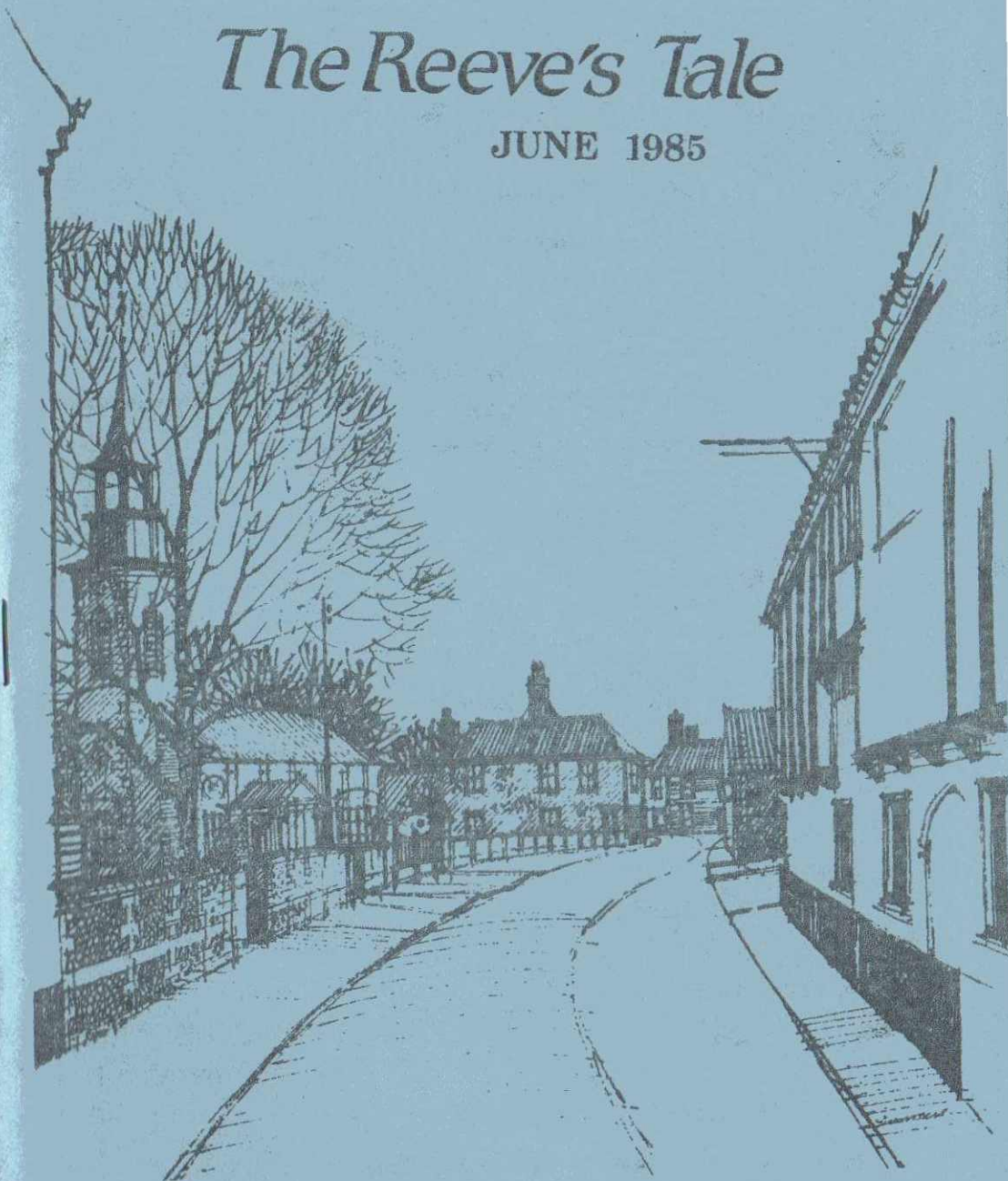

Dear Friends,

## BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL

A.G.M. Monday 20th May 1985 in village hall

All Council members were present and Mrs. Janet Hatley our Breckland District Council representative also present 6 parishioners.

### Election of Officials.

Peter Kane was re-elected as Chairman.

### Recreation Committee.

The existing Committee was re-elected.

### Recreation Facilities.

At long last the Deeds for the grounds are held in the Bank on our behalf. Cost of land was £15,000., but with the help of B.D.G. Grant, Amenities Fund, Interest Free Loan, fund raising and Parish Council money, £8,200., has been paid towards costs, leaving a balance of £6,800 to be paid within the next 10 years. An open general meeting will be arranged fairly soon and it is now up to the Parishioners to decide what and how soon it can be a visible proposition.

### Transport.

There has been a revision of Eastern Counties Bus time-table of services. Parishioners are advised to check with the new time-table. The one change is the mid morning bus on a Wednesday which now leaves 11 minutes earlier at 10.06am, to allow for the extra journey round Elsing and Lyng.

### Audit.

Parish accounts are due for audit, at the Assembly Rooms, Dereham, between 10 and 17 June 1985. A balance sheet is on view in the Parish notice-board. Parish documents may be viewed prior to audit by contact with the Parish Clerk: Phone Bawdeswell 312.

### Planning.

An increase of applications, 18 as against 12 in previous period: 11 approved, 3 outline only approved, 3 refused and 1 appeal refused.

### Highways.

The flooding in Reepham Road is due to obstruction in piping in the one area either side of the road. Highways Dept., Watton, have cleared obstructions, but it has recurred and further more detailed action is necessary to completely clear the problem.

### Membership.

The Parish Council will continue to be members of the Norfolk County Association of Parish and Town Councils, and Norfolk Playing Fields Association and provide Lotteries facilities.

### Land Deeds.

The old surveyors land area at "Reepham Road", Adams Pit or Water" and in "Bawdeswell Heath" are at present with the Charity Commissioners, London. When these are completed the land will be transferred from Breckland District Council to Bawdeswell Parish Council, who will be then responsible for their future maintenance and development for the benefit of the Parish.

### Post Box.

Dereham Road box has caused something like a storm in a teacup. The Clerk has corresponded with Norwich and Dereham Postal Authorities and it now transpires that the postal bag over the box was to conceal a damaged door. It is a pity the information was not passed on locally when it happened.
