



Bewdeswell Parish Council

Items covered duting the Parish Council meeting on Monday 15th July 1985.

1. As usual there was no meeting planned during August as it is holiday time. The next meeting will take place in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on the 16th September 1985. All parishioners are welcome.

2. Old Surveyors Land

The 21 days notive displayed for the Declaration of Transfer of these areas from District to Parish Council responsibility has expired and the documents are now with the Charity Commissioners for the final arrangements.

An on-site visit at Adams Pit was arronged with Mr Scowen, an environmental scientist from Norfolk County Council, interested in the upkeep of ponds; also present were Councillors — Kane, Eglington, Smith and the Parish Clerk. Mr Scowen is very interested in the project and has given adviceas to what the Parish can do to start with, i.e. clear away undergrowth and rubbish and then a further check will be made to decide what help can be given from the County Council. Arrangements were made and with the help of parents and BMX enthusiasts, a sponsored weekend scheme has started clearing the pond.

3. Highways was a learned the wind by

A on site visit was arranged between Mr.Jefferies of Highways Dept. and the Parish Clerk in July to confirm positions for planting trees this Autumn in the Fakenham and Norwich Roads near the Bus Shelters and opposite the village school.

A letter has been sent to the Highways Dept. at the request of Councillor Curtis, comerning the lack of pedestrian footpaths along Dereham and Reepham Roads. It is requested that road signs "Caution -No Footpaths" be positioned to warm vehicle drivers of the dangers concerning pedestrians.

5. Recreation Centre

The present Insurance Policy held by the Council will cover normal activities on playing fields;
BMX and childrens play areas will also, subject to supervision and inspection controls, be covered.
Buildings are not covered, but the two Bus Shelters will now be covered under a new section to be added to our policy, and also any future buildings contemplated for the recreation area.

A further £1775.00 has been transferred from Council funds to Recreation Account.

6. Re-numbering Council Houses

The re-numbering of dwellings in Folland Court and Paradise Road came into effect from 15th august 1905; it is hoped that inconvenience to residents will be minimal.

7. Citizens's Advice Bureau

The Council has made a grant of £5.00 to assist this activity. The workload at Dereham Cherry Tree car park offices within the last twelve months has increased enormously and will now be open on Wednesdays and Fridays from 10.00am to 3.00pm.

Advice is free.

8. Parish Documents

Old 1800 documents of the Inclosure Act of Parliament for Bawdeswell have been purchased from Mr Barrett of the Bell Inn Flats for the sum of £19.00.

9. Footpaths

Councillo Smith requested bridle-way signs for the Heath and Common Lane, also foot-path signs at Elsing Lane will be considered in the allecation of signs from the District Council during 1986.






