Meeting held on Monday, 16th June, 1986 in the Village Hall at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Councillor R. Eglington (Chairman), Councillors - Irene Ames, John Ames, Olive Curtis, Peter Kane and Tony Smith. Also attending 3 parishioners.

Apologies: Councillor V. Ward and Mrs. J. Hatley, B.D.C. Representative. Minutes of previous meeting held on 21st April, 1986 taken as read - agreed and signed.

1. Matters Arising.

- 2. Bus Sholter. Repairs have been carried out for the vandalised damage to the Fakenham Road shelter, thanks to the effort of Councillor Smith. The bench seat which has twice been broken down has not been replaced for the time being.
- 3. Recreation Ground. Planning application in progress for change of use, also arrangements are in hand for the improvement to access. It is much regretted that support so far for fund raising has sadly been very poor indeed. The future prospects for the village enjoyment of sporting activities outdoor and evening entertainments are unlimited, but without the necessary support a golden opportunity will be passed over.
- 4. <u>Heath</u>. Councillor John Ames will attend and represent the Parish Council on future Heath Trustees meetings.
- 5. Audit. Auditors wish to see Deeds of the Recreation Ground. No further observations concerning Parish Council's records of Accounts.

6. Planning.

- 3/86/0071: Conversion of Chapel to dwelling. B.D.C. Observation Planning permission granted.
- 3/86/0493: Laying of private drive-way and drains. B.D.C. Observation Planning permission granted.
- 3/86/0663: Mr. J. Nicola. Attach Entrance Porch to Dwelling. P.C. Observation: No objections.
- 3/86/0737: Mr. D. Gurney. Alteration: new conservatory and new garage.
 P.C. Observation: Pleased to see a great improvement to property.
- 7. Land Paradise Road (0.S. 3971). Reply from B.D.C. stating the matter concerning the water hazard in this area is being dealt with and necessary fencing will be erected. Proposed by Councillor Kane and Seconded by Councillor Smith, that all authorities concerned in this matter should be kept informed and that written replies be retained. Agreed.
- 8. Footpath. A full discussion took place regarding Public Right of Way Footpaths within the village boundaries. It was agreed an on-site meeting of the Councillors take place for 7.30 p.m., Thursday, 19th June at No.5 Elsing path. It is proposed to arrange a package deal between all concerned covering all our footpaths.
- 9. Best Kept Village Poster Competition. Mr. Jefferies would clear up the matter within the Department and would then decide the action to be taken.


