FOOD FOR THOUGHT

ORANGE SORBET

2 large oranges 50g (2 oz) granulated sugar 2 tablespoons water 1 egg white (size 5 or 6) 25g (1 oz) caster sugar

Carnish : mint leaves

Preparation time : 20 minutes, plus freezing time

Cooking time : 8 minutes

1. Cut the tops off the oranges and scoop out the flesh, using a teaspoon or Grapefruit knife. Do this over a bowl to catch the juice. Wrap the orange cases in cling film and chill until ready for use.

2. Press the orange pulp and juice through a large meshed sieve. Place the granulated sugar and water in a small pan and bring slowly to the boil, stirring until the sugar is dissolved. Boil for 5 minutes, then stir in the orange pulp and remove from the heat.

3. When the orange mixture is cool, pour it into a shallow tray and place in freezer for 2 - 3 hours, until softly frozen.

4. Whisk the egg white until stiff, then whisk in the caster sugar. Place the softly frozen orange mixture into a chilled bowl and break down with a fork. Whisk in the meringue mixture.

5. Return the sorbet to the freezer for about 2 hours, until frozen. Spoon the mixture into the orange cases ready to serve. Decorate with mint leaves.

If there's more sorbet than will fit in the orange cases, it can be kept in the freezer for another occasion.

Rinse out the used orange cases and re-use. They keep fine in the freezer!

FOXLEY ST. THOMAS TOWER APPEAL

We very much hope that repairs to the tower and other work required to be done in Phase I will start soon. We have been offered a 40% Grant by the Commission for Ancient Buildings, which will be a great help.

In the twelve months from October 1984 to September 1985 we raised just over £5,000 from special events and donations. We are extremely grateful to all the good people who made efforts to make this possible. They worked so hard that we thought it best not to have any more special events this year but to try to raise so much money as possible by direct donations or promises.

We not only need to raise more money to complete work on the Tower but to the other repairs and to contribute towards the regular costs of the Church and of the Ministry.

Some years ago, a Committee of the Church considered what should be the standard of giving to the church and to other charitable bodies. It was decided that 5p, in the £ of income should be the average target.

In addition, to the repairs, already to be done, this year we have the five-yearly Architects' inspection of the Church, which may reveal the need for further repairs, involving more cost.

We propose to have a special gift week from 29 June to 6 July at St Thomas-tide (St Thomas day is 3 July)

The Rector will be in the Church on Saturday 5 July to receive gifts.

With this copy of the Reeves Tale for Foxley is enclosed an envelope for your gift or promise to give regularly so much a week, month, quarter, half year or year. - 1. The period 1985/86 saw the recreation ground developed in the following manner:
 - a) The land cultivated and seeded with suitable hard-wearing grass seed.
 - b) A fence of 6 ft. chain link with iron posts was erected along part of the north boundary.
 - c) The entrance from Reepham Road was developed by the removal of a hedge and bank, thereby providing reasonable vehicle and pedestrian access.

2. All work to date has been completed with volunteer resources and costs have been limited to the price of materials only.

Mr. G. Wells raised the question regarding availability of allotments on part of the recreation grounds. This was not thought a practical proposition however, the Surveyors land, Reepham Road, could in time become available and suitable for this purpose.

Planning 1985 period 7 applications actioned. 6 full planning, 1 outline only all approved. 1 appeal not granted.

Parish Council Deeds A copy of the Deeds for the Recreation Ground and the Charity Commissioners Deeds for Old Surveyors land were passed around for information and all to see.

Highway Verge Councillor Kane referred to the childrens hazard on the piece of land opposite the Chapel at the entrance to Paradise Road. Due to Laying of a large drainage system for the disposal of surface water from the Council housing area, a deep accumulation of water is trapped on the waste piece of land. Children taking a short cut along the drain could fall into the water which is deep enough to cause alarm. Suggested Clerk investigate ownership of the area.

Road Traffic Councillor Smith drew attention to the build up of cars on the grass area opposite the Bawdeswell Nursery and the danger likely to be caused by it. Also had it been permitted for a flag to be displayed and for the removal of some of the boundry trees. Clerk stated he Highways Department had been approached, also the Police and neither had raised objections. It was agreed further information should be obtained and in a written form.

On closing the meeting the Chairman also Councillor Smith wished to thank Councillor Kane for his three years of dedicated hard work and interest taken in the office of Chairman. Chairman Eglington sincerely hoped he would be able to follow this lead. This was unanimously agreed.
