Dear Friends,

I'm getting excited! No, not because I will be presenting a brand new gospel music programme on BBC Radio Norfolk between 5 - 6.00 pm each Sunday afternoon from 9 March; nor because I'll be having a few days holiday next month! My excitement stems from the fact that we're fast approaching Easter which, for anyone who has a living faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, marks the pin-point of that faith and the reality from which it stems. The message of Easter speaks of the triumph of good over evil and of life over death, for it records the well testified facts of Jesus' resurrection, which means we can know him here and now as the Living Lord. In one of the Lent programmes on Radio Norfolk a couple of weeks ago, the speaker Rev Bob Baker the Rector of Brundall, said that if Christ's Resurrection could be conclusively disproved he would renounce his faith. Writing much earlier, St. Paul reminded his readers at corinth that if Christ had not been raised then his preaching and their faith were both in vain, and he goes on "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all men to be pitied" (I Cor Ch 15:19).

But of course he then reminds them, and us that that is far from the truth "In fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep". So too, my excitement of joyous Easter worship is linked to the belief in the resurrection of Christ, and it's an excitement in which you can share both by joining in the services at the local churches on Easter Sunday 30 March and by listening in to a special edition of that new gospel music programme I mentioned earlier, on the same day.

May I wish you a Happy and Joyous Easter.

Best Kept Village Competition

5. By a majority decision of 5 to 2, it was agreed to enter for this competition. Preliminary judging starts from 1st May, continuing through May and June. All the help from parishioners will be required if the village is to present a reasonable contest. Further details in April's Reeve's Tale.

Recreation Committee Chairman, V. Ward's report 11

6. The question of vehicle access is still being pursued with the owners of adjoining property. Aselution has yet to be reached.

7. A Social evening organised by the Committee was held on 25th January; this was well attended and considered a success, numerous comments were recorded indicating that further similar evenings would be well received. An overall profit of £200.00 was generated which will help the Recreation funds.

8. Erection of a fund raising sign in the village centre Permission has been obtained from the Chief Housing Officer, B.D.C. for its siting alongside the Parish Council notice board. The voluntary services of a painter have been obtained to assist in this matter; cost should be restricted to materials, i.e. post, board, screws and paint.

9. The policy of the Committee is to cover the labour content of any work with the assistance of volunteers whenever possible. The erection of the Recreation Ground fence was a good example where cost was restricted to materials only. To this end, it would be helpful to have a list of available resources. We would be looking for assistance in two areas - (1) Use of plant and equipment with particular reference to earth moving, tractors and trailers, cement mixers, etc. (2) The offer of voluntary labour with particular reference to the building trades.

10. B.D.C. representative, Mrs Janet Hatley, stated that the increase would be 1p making it 14p in the £.

School

11. Rumours of the Primary School closure are incorrect, and we hope the increase in local families will endeavour to ensure its long and enlightening future for the parishes.

Footpaths

11. Mr. C. Hanson-Smith, Foxley Lodge, has reported to the Clerk that the footpath from Elsing Lane leading to Sparham Hoe has been ploughed up, and walking made difficult. The Chairman stated that he and members of the Council would visit the site to verify the conditions.

NEXT MEETING will be on Monday 17th March 1986 in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm. Public and Press welcome.
