

THE ORIGIN OF THE "SURVEYORS' LAND" IN FOXLEY

We have a number of documents dating back to 1735 relating to our home and noted references in some of them to "Surveyors' Land". The renting of the Surveyors' Land has been discussed recently at the Parish Council meetings and we thought that other villagers might like to know more about its origin.

The references were in the awards of land allocated under the "Act for inclosing lands within the Parish of Foxley, in the County of Norfolk", dated September 22nd 1815. On page 5 of the extract from the Commissioners' Award there is a paragraph entitled "Allotments to the Surveyors' of the Highways". Further investigation of the Diocesan copy of the Act and its map in the Norwich Record Office showed that this land was that now known as the "Surveyors Land" at the end of the Street, Foxley where Themel thorpe Road starts.

The Commissioners appointed by the Act of Parliament were named John Dugmore, William Unthank and William Withers, the Younger. They employed Surveyors to measure the record the land claimed by various landowners; copyholders; freeholders and tenants. The Surveyors also defined public roads; private roads; boundaries; public food paths; the public drain; fences; ditches and hedges. The land allocated to the Surveyors was 2 acres in extent. It was bounded by land allotted to Charles Leaman to the North; Sir John Lombe to the East and South (in part); by a private road to the South (in part) and the Themelthorpe Road to the west.

The land was (quote) "set out as and for public Clay and Sand Pits and to the intent that the same allotments shall for ever hereafter be used by the owners and occupiers of lands and estates within that said Parish of Foxley, for the time being and for ever, in a reasonable and proper manner, for the repair of the houses, outbuildings fence-walls, and barnfloors, in the said Parish".

The Concept of the use of this land has of viously changed since 1815 and we can only assume that the Parish Council inherited responsibilities by another Act of Parliament.

Other details on the map which may be of interest were that in 1815 Chapel Road was called Themelthorpe Read, Mill Road was Hill Common Road at the Foxley end and Guilteross Read at the Billingford end.

LANCASHIRE LEMON FINGERS

1:0g/6oz Self Raising Flour, sifted 1:0g/6oz Caster Sugar 1:0g/6oz Butter, Softened 2 Eggs Grated rind and juice of 1 Lemon 1:0g/4oz Icing Sugar

Put the flour, caster sugar, butter, eggs and lemon rind in a bowl and beat together until will blended. Spread the mixture in a 12 by 8:n sandwich cake tin which has been lined with greased greaseproof paper. Bake in a moderate oven, 180C, 350F, Gas Mark 4 for 15 minutes or until pale golden brown. Mix together the lemon juice and icing sugar. Spread over the cake while it is still warm. Leave to cool in the tin, then turn out and cut into 24 fingers.

NE. Do not mix the lemon juice and icing sugar until immediately before needed, otherwise it will solidify.

MINUTES OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL A YUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD THE VILLAGE HALL ON MONDAY, 18TH MAY, 1987

A full council were in attendance also Mr. David Sayer (Member of Breckland District Council for Eynsford Ward) and 7 parishioners.

The outgoing Chairman opened the meeting and made a presentation to Mr. Sparkes and thanked him for his past efforts as Parish Clerk, he also thanked the councillors who had decided not to stand for re-election this year. His feelings were echood by all the council.

Apologies - No apologies - everyone in attendance.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN Chairmen - Councillor Smith proposed Councillor Ward and was seconded by Councillor Neil. Councillor Eglington proposed Councillor Sparkes and was

seconded by Councillor Smith. After a show of hands Councillor Ward was appointed by a majority vote. <u>Vice-Chairman</u> - Councillor Smith proposed Councillor Sparkes and was seconded by Councillor Wright. Agreed unanimously. The new chairman took over the meeting and said that several councillors had decided to stand down this year, he thanked them for their past efforts and hered that the new council would put in as much time and effort as the previous council. The minutes of the previous AGM were taken as read, agreed and were signed.

FINANCE - All members of the council looked at the balance sheet which showed an amount of £300.00 in hand. However,' out of this s m the election expenses have to be paid, this was thought to be in excess of £100.00.

Signing of cheques - with a new council, Councillor Sparkes stated that there would have to be new signatories for cheques. It was agreed that these would the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Councillor Smith.

The Chairman stated that the financial situation should be looked into in more depth and should be put on the agenda for the next meeting.

Recreation Ground Committee - Two members as last year plus Councillor Farthing. Councillor Sparkes said that ideally he would like to see a committee of ten to tweIve made up of th se councillors and interested parishioners.

Under the deeds of the present village hall it may be possible to move the village hall to another location provided there was agreement from the village hall committee, the Parish Council and the Bowls Club. It was decided that the subject should be discussed in more depth at the next meeting.

Heath Ropresentative - Councillor Smith agreed to take this on - agreed unanimously.

<u>Deeds</u> - Deeds to the Recroation Ground and to the Surveyors Lands were shown to the Council and are available to be viewed by anyone interested.

Any Other Business - Councillor Sparkes thanked Councillor Eglington for the book he had been presented with "Treasures of Britain". He welcomed the new councillors and clerk and thanked John Ames who had joined the council in May, 1974, Irene Ames who had joined in May, 1979 and Olive Curtis who had joined in August, 1974 for their long and faithful service to the council.

1. <u>School</u> - Miss Joice reported that the school appeared to be in good heart and that the danger of the number of pupils falling below 60 appeared to be over with only six children leaving this year and 28 in the Reception Class.

2. <u>Waste Paper</u> - It was stated that no suitable place had become available for the storage of waste paper.

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL MONDAY, 1ST JUNE, 1987

<u>Finance</u> - The financial situation was discussed and it was agreed that fund raising was of prime importance. It was stated that verbal agreement to this had been given by the Village Hall and Bowls Club trustees. A valuation would also be obtained from a local estate agent. This was agreed unanimously. Again the subject of fundraising was brought up with possible ideas of a quiz, fashion show. Ideally there should be a fund raising event held each month.

Planning - Re-positioning of Plot 3 Black Horse Meadow - no observations.

Dwellings Beside Church - the question of a hard access road onto this site was raised. Clerk to check whether this is stated on planning permission and if necessary follow up with letter to Council.

There is no doubt that all Parishioners will be pleased to know that the turn out for the Poll was on a par with the generally accepted overall average for the Election.




