



MINUTES OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MERTING HELD ON MONDAY 5TH OCTOBER IN THE VILLAGE HALL.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Taken as read, agreed and signed.

#### MATTERS ARISING: -

- 1. Heritage Map. It was decided to put a piece in the Reeves Tale asking people to look at the Heritage Map and to see if there was enough interest to warrant someone coming from Breckland District Council to address a meeting on the map. An inaccuracy had been noted concerning the reference to the Church which was supposedly built in a colonial style in honour of an American plane which had crashed into it during the war. Mr. Ames who was present at the meeting, stated that the plane which had crashed had been flown by British pilots and was a Mosquito. The Church being built in the style it had been was due to the Architect and nothing to do with being a memorial. It was agreed a letter should be written to Peter Tolhurst at Breckland District Council informing him of this. It was hoped that parishoners would point out any other mistakes so that these could be corrected.
- 2. Parish Clerk. It was stated that Tracey Colman would be taking over the position of Parish Clerk with effect from the beginning of 1988, owing to the resignation of the present Clerk.

FINANCE. Councillor Sparkes asked whether it was thought worthwhile to renew membership of the Playing Fields Association. It was agreed unanimously that this was worthwhile.

RECREATION GROUND. Councillor Ward gave an up date on what had been happening since the last Parish Council meeting and stated that two meetings had been held and letters had been written to all the interested parties, i.e., the Bowls Club, Village Hall Committee and the Football Club, no replies had yet been received. He stated that an officer from Breckland D.C., had been asked for his advice on layout etc., for the field and he had been supplied with measurements. A reply is expected in two weeks. Councillor Wright asked if the minutes of the Recreation Ground Committee would be available for everyone to read. Councillor Ward stated that a Secretary and Treasurer had now been appointed and the minutes would in future be available. Clr. Smith stated he bought a report in the Reeves Tale would be preferable to
