One of the New Testament writers likened the need for perseverance in the Christian life to a race and he too, was able to direct us, to a supreme example to take as our guide - "let us with perseverance run the race that is set before us - looking to Jesus the author and finisher of our faith".

Foul Drainage - Chairman opened the meeting with a brief summary of the position to date. A number of letters have been sent to Richard Ryder MP, who is acting for us, answers were received. Finance/Recreation Ground - The Chairman stated that at the meeting held with regard to the Recreation Ground several people had expressed an interest in joining the Recreation Ground Committee and the Village Hall, Bowls Club and the Playgroup are now represented. VILLIGE RECREATION FACILITIES.

I would like to take this opportunity to advise you of rogress on the provision of Village Recreational facilities. The long-term objective is to provide an area of land of sufficient size to enable the provision of a football pitch.

tennis courts, childrens play area etc., together with a Recreation Centre building providing a clubroom, ammenities hall, changingrooms etc.

An area of land comprising of approximately 5% acres has been obtained, which will meet the above objective, together with ample car parking. The siting is important, as it should not cause a nuisance to residents through noise and car parking. as could be the case if located within the centre of the village, and yet it must not be too far removed. thereby rausing problems for access. Located just into the Reepham Road, the location is as near to the ideal location as we could get.

Planning approval has been obtained in the lands change of use from agriculture to recreation. The road verge has been widened and the County Council will be extending the pavement into the Recreation Ground's entrance at any time now. This will overcome the problem of having to walk in the road in order to gain access.

The way forward, as we see it, is the formation of a Village Recreation Club. All villagers wishing to use the facilities would become a member and make an annual contribution. designed to offset the costs of fixed and variable overheads associated with the Centre. Members Wishing to take part in a particular activity i.e., Tennis, would form a tennis section which would be responsible for the provision and maintenance of the necessary facilities. To this end the section would set up its own additional membership fees.

To date discussions are in progress with the existing Village Hall Committee, looking at an acceptable way to replace the Hall with a new Recreation Centre located on the Reepham Road land, any arrangement would require that the new building was ready for occupation before the existing building was disposed of.

VILLAGE RECREATION FACILITIES (cont'd).

Discussions are also taking place with the Football Club and the Bowls Club, looking at a possible move onto the new recreation ground.

Fund raising activities will not, at this stage, be directed towards individual activities, but towards costs associated with the land and the provision of a new building. When discussions with the Village Hall Committee have concluded, a balance sheet will be published indicating how much money we have available as a start towards the new building.

Arrangements are in hand to seek advice (free) on (1) the best layout for activities, thus maximising use of the recreation ground and (2) a plan and specification for a new building. When these are in hand, in a draft form, it is intended to hold a public meeting, thereby giving people the opportunity to see what is happening and to comment. sed and orif they so wish. I set to a

The recreation Committee has been increased in size from its original concept, additional members offering their services to assist in fund raising activities and the provision of facilities. These people will probably be contacting you in the near future and seek your support in various fund raising activities.

We have the opportunity now to provide a range of recreational facilities within the village for both adults and children, all that is required for this to succeed is your support.


