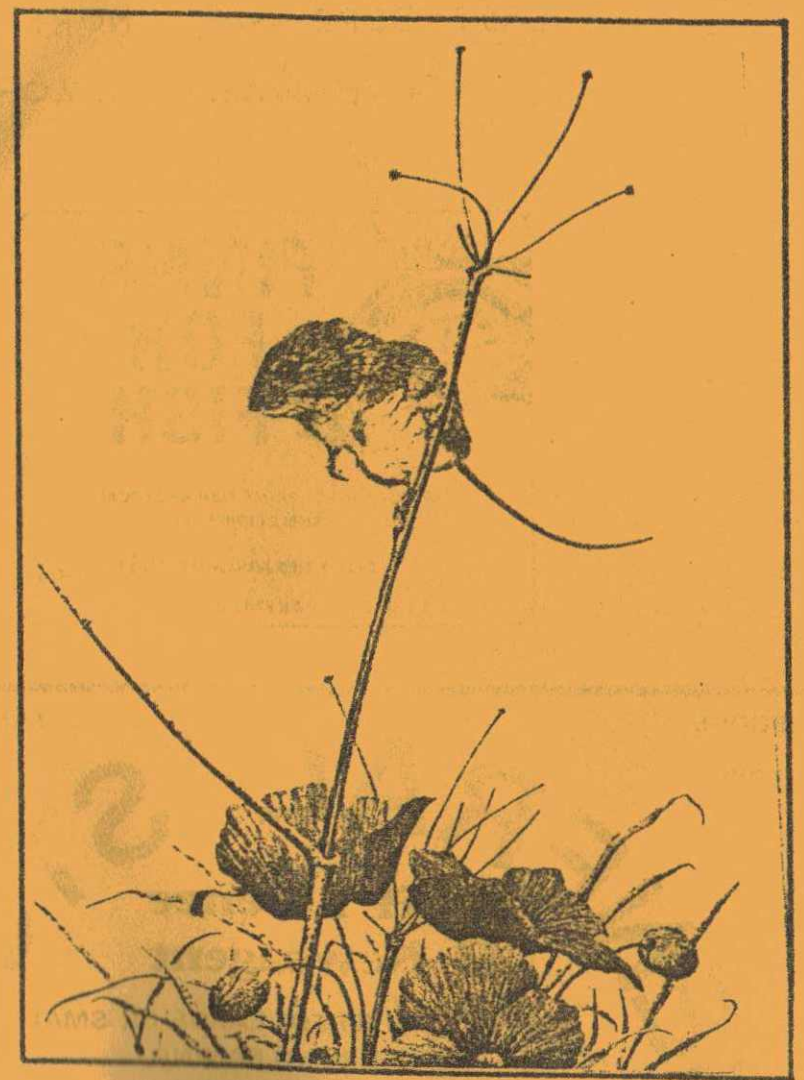

 Lost and Found - Judging by noticeboards, newspaper columns and lost pets details on local radio, a large number of people go through the agony of losing something of value from time to time. For me last month, it was my wallet - missing for only inside of a day but still, a source of worry until it was found. It brought home to me personally what Jesus was talking about in some of his best loved teaching stories - the parables. Though good stories in themselves, they were used by Jesus to bring home a deeper point in his teaching. Thankfully, no one is "beyond redemption" but it is only in the finding that rejoicing is real - for the believer and for God Himself.

- \* Minutes of Previous meeting - Taken as read, agreed and signed.
- \* Finance - Recreation Ground - Councillor Ward stated that he had met representatives from the Football Club who had said they were willing to help out where possible with the Recreation Ground and Councillor Sparkes stated that it may well be worth also contacting the local playgroup who might also be interested.

Councillor Ward and Councillor Sparkes had visited the Bank Manager in Dereham and it was believed that the Bank would look favourably upon lending the Council a further sum to repay loans and to pay outstanding bills and interest charges. After discussion Councillor Smith suggested a sum of £1,000 this was seconded by Councillor Eglinton and then agreed unanimously.

- \* Audit - Councillor Sparkes stated that the Audit Book was still being held over a query on a sum paid by the Bawdeswell Amenities Committee for the land purchased for the Recreation ground. He stated that he had sent a letter to the Solicitors, sorting the matter out. Councillor Smith said that if the Solicitors were not happy with Councillor Sparkes letter of explanation, he would go and sort the matter out himself.
- \* Recreation Ground Sports Equipment - Councillor Smith said that he had a letter stating that a grant would be available for Sports equipment for the Recreation Ground which had to be taken up by 1989.
- \* Planning - Bawdeswell Hall - Extra Access

Meeting held to discuss: PLANNING APPLICATION FOR ONE DWELLING NEXT TO WOODBINE HOUSE, THE STREET

Although a meeting is not normally held in August, it was decided that it was necessary to meet to look over the outline Planning Permission sought for the above location. From the information available there were no objections.

Other Business Finance - Councillor Sparkes stated that the Ledger had now been returned. He stated that with the debit ceiling of £4,500 there was an amount of £150 in hand. Bills paid were repayment of free loans and Local Parish Council Association fees. Bills still to be paid insurance, playing fields maintenance, village hall rent and also three more quarters of bank interest on loan at £170 per quarter.

Highways - Councillor Sparkes stated that pot holes in Dereham Road, Reepham Road and Norwich Road and The Street have been filled. Drains down Reepham Road have been cleared and the Recreation Ground is on the list for infilling, the Council had said it would help if the surface could be levelled.

Church Close development - Councillor Neil asked if another letter could be written to Breckland District Council regarding the access road onto this site which should have been made up prior to building began, of late there has been a considerable amount of mud left on the road off the track onto the site.

MINUTES OF FOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held on Monday,  
22nd June, 1987 at 8.00 p.m. Village Hall.

Present: T. Cook, K. Murrell, C. Skinner, W. Potter, M. Joice, M. De'Ath (Clerk)

Also Present: 22 Parishioners. Two engineers from Anglian Water also attended.

The meeting opened with the clerk calling for nominations for Chairman and Vice Chairman.

Returning Officer was informed of co-option of C. Skinner and W. Potter and are now on record at Attleborough as serving members of this Council.

The new Chairman K. Murrell thanked retiring Chairman T. Cook for his work over the last two years.

Matters Arising

Foul Drainage - was the only item dealt with - 2 engineers from Anglian Water Mr. Chapman and Mr. Hemsley from North Norfolk Division attended to answer questions.

Mr. Hemsley said they would be happy to answer questions on the Main Drain running down The Street and he went on to say Mr. Davis was the first person to complain about the Sewage problem. (Clerk discovered the first recorded minute on the problem was in July, 1952 brought by Mr. Norman Davis and raised at subsequent meetings with no response from Dept. of Public Health. Mr. Paul Davis brought the matter up again in 1979 with the same results).

Breckland were responsible for Sewage from 1974 until 1985. Anglian Water have now accepted the drain as a Public Sewer and intend doing something about it. Definition of Public Sewer is a drain or land drain or sewer down which foul sewage is flowing. It is thought that sewage from other old properties is passing into the drain. Parishioners are of the opinion the trouble started when new houses were erected. Mr. Chapman then spoke of the proposals Anglian Water have to correct the problem. The bottom end only will be dealt with. Small treatment works to be fitted or Pumping Station. They intend fitting a couple of pumps to be pumped down to Bawdeswell. More difficult to quantify is the rain water, they may have to utilise, the flow will go from Septic Tank to sewer, the pumps will handle that but with a lot of rain another pump will come in. Size of pumps may



change depending on how many houses the drain will have to serve. The work should be finished this year, time scale is the end of November at an approx. cost of £50,000. It's not the policy of Anglian Water to spend money on first time sewage schemes. Money for proper sewerage is paid for through General Rate. We were told that A.W. is well short of money, spending something in the region of £20 million a year which is not sufficient, another £10 million needs to be spent to keep functioning properly. When asked where the pumps would be sited the engineer stated at the existing septic tank and would be housed in a small kiosk, noise would be minimal. If however the problem proves to be a Public Health matter something must be done. For proof of health hazard individuals must bring the problem to the attention of Dept. of Public Health. Potentially about 30 properties are connected to the old sewer and cost of connection to the proposed scheme will cost residents around £500 each property. Chairman Murrell thanked Messrs. Chapman and Hemsley for attending the meeting. Meeting closed at 9.45 p.m. the next part of this meeting to be held on 29th June, 1987. Since that date we have handed the matter over to Mr. Richard Ryder, M.P. and he has taken up the fight on our behalf.

Village Hall - Chairman Murrell called for firm ideas on the Village Hall and asked "Do we need a Village Hall?" Councillors unanimously agreed, we do. The Hall has confirmed bookings for 3 nights each week and Bowls night has proved very popular. Some difficulty has been experienced in forming a committee, however the problem is now solved as a meeting was held on 13th July.

Mr. Murrell declared himself willing to open the meeting and set it in motion and at this a Committee was formed.

Surveyors Land - It was agreed a private meeting should be held to discuss the land and has been arranged for 8th July, 1987, Village Hall.

Library Halt Seat - It was agreed to go ahead with the buying of the seat, and a new position was suggested for the placing of the seat.

Ornamental Village Sign - Some research will be done to decide the type of sign, the suggestion is for one sign only sited at the memorial.

Any Other Business - All old jumble at Village Hall will be cleared by International League for Protection of Horses.

Phone Box - vandalised - Clerk to inform Telecom.

Gas Operated Bird Scarer - Reported operating all night creating a nuisance. Clerk to contact police.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme - Police to be invited to next meeting to discuss the scheme.

Highway Signs - The "Give Way" sign and the "Dangerous Bend" sign have been down for some time in West Foxley. Clerk to notify Highways.
