







But it isn't just bishops whose faith needs to be evident in all they do and say. Every Christian has the same responsibility to Christ.


Do enjoy your holiday whether at home or away and continue to remember the bishops in your prayers as the 1988 Lambeth Conference draws to its close.



After some discussion, it was agreed that the council would accept Mr. Rogers offer to get in touch with the owners of the adjacent land to see if arrangements could be made.




