Dear Friends,

All of us, I'm sure, have gone through what we call a "wilderness experience". Those times of feeling low, depressed and spiritually dry. Many of the Christian Saints through the ages, whose example seem to mark them out as being on a higher plain than us, are often the first to confess to periods of doubt and despair. They refer to their arid state in wilderness terms.

Though I knew the experience I have to admit to never having visited an actual wilderness. My training course in the Holy Land, however, changed that TWO visits to the barren southern region near the Dead Sea helped me to appreciate aspects of Jesus' ministry and relate the term "wilderness experience" to a real wilderness. Though admittedly barren and remote the wilderness has a strange beauty and hidden compensations. visited the Wilderness of Zin and were fortunate enough to be taken by our coachdriver off the main road and down an extremely windy track into the Rift Valley below us. We then only had a short walk to discover one of the most wonderful experience of my visit water in the dessert! Literally along the base of the valley were what I can best describe as Sheringham Rock pools dotted all around us. I sat on a rock as the rest of the party continued still further. Soom I became aware of lovely birds flitting between the sparse scrub and the pools. I bex deer appeared on inaccessible rock pinnacles. The wilderness was barren no more.

When our experience of life seems to reflect the wilderness rather than lush countryside perhaps with God's help we might be privileged to discover that he is there with us and gives us glimpses of his presence.

MINUTES OF FOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 25TH JAN. VILLAGE HALL, 8.00 P.M.

All Councillors present plus 4 parishioners and Mr. David Sayer, B.D.C. representative.

Minutes of previous meeting taken as read, signed.

MATTERS ARISING

Foul Drainage - A) - Existing System - Chairman contacted Mr. Chapman of Anglian Water to enquire programme of work which had fallen behind schedule. A.W. now plan to start cleaning out existing drains in February, after this will come manholes and rising main. They have allocated in next years budget for any trouble they may encounter. A.W. are probably interested in renting a small part of Surveyors Land approx. 10 x 10 metres. They will also supply a plan of route and size of rising main.

B) - Extension to Existing System - Letter received stating B.D.C. must make the first move. Mr. Sayer stated A.W. are dealing with at least 80% of the village and consider the project only minor, there is not a lot of sewerage work going on, presumably to keep the rates down. Foxley Parish Council have made formal application for first time sewerage for the whole of Foxley, and the matter will be placed before the Environmental Health Committee for consideration at its meeting on 23rd February, 1988.

Ornamental Village Sign - Agreed unanimously Miss Webdale's design of Fox in Wood. Mr. Cook proposed - seconded by Mrs. Joice that Miss Webdale receives £20. Also £5 to Miss Waters for her design, agreed unanimously. Mr. Murrell to contact Mr. David Nottage who has agreed to act as agent to obtain free estimate to carve Miss Webdale's design.

Village Hall Signs - Proposed by Mr. Cook, seconded by Mr. Skinner that Parish Council order signs etc. Parish Clerk to write to B.D.C. Highways.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme - At the meeting held on 18th January, it was agreed there is a basis for 2 schemes. Schemes to be set up by co-ordinators who were named as Mrs. Helen Cook and Mr. John Fletcher for Foxley Village and Mrs. Marjorie De'Ath for West Foxley. Residents to receive information on the scheme by letter or visit by the co-ordinator.

Present - Councillors C. Sparkes, (Chairman), L. Neil, R. Eglington, M. Farthing, A. Smith & A. Wright. Discrict Courcillor D. Sayer and 11 parishioners.

Minutes of previous meetings - Meetings held 4.1.88 and 15.1.88 taken as read, agreed and signed.

MATTERS ARISING - 3/87/1946F Proposed Planning Development on land off Hall Road.

Chairman opened a general discussion stating the main six points as recorded in the Reeve's Tale, February issue, which were fully covered at the 15.1.88 meeting, had been returned to Planning Dept. along with the attached list of 30 parishioners signatures agreeing with remarks as submitted.

Points raised in open discussion - Councillor Wright suggested incoming items concerning agenda matters should be circulated to Councillors before meeting - this would be considered. Mrs. Irene Ames stated the minutes of 15.1.88 meeting, not reported in Reeve's Tale. Chairman - full details not published due to late receipt by Editor for publication. It was also suggested the 31 dwellings should be spread within village and not confined to 3.6 acre site. Chairman replied matter had been taken up with Mr. Rudkin, Planning Dept. who confirmed the density was well within standard practice per acre. It must also be remembered the extra people in the village would mean eventual added facilities. Parishioners still have plenty of time if they wish to write direct to THE CHIEF PLANNING OFFICER. THE GUILDHALL, DEREHAM, NR19 1EE stating their personal views which should be more influential. District Councillor D. Sayer had requested information regarding previous appeals concerning development in the area. Clerk was able to provide the necessary documents. D. Saver said he would study them and make use of information extracted. Councillor Smith asked if he would look into developments now in the village and whether they were in accordance with planning applications. D. Sayer said he would certainly look to the interest of the village and speak on its behalf.
