





THIS MONTH'S GOOD FARE

As leeks are now plentiful, a reader has suggested the following recipe which she has found to be delicious:

Leek and Ham in Cheese Sauce

4 medium size leeks - cooked whole 4 slices of ham 3 ozs. grated cheese 1½ ozs. butter or margarine ½ pint of milk 1 full tablespoon of flour ½ teaspoon of mustard seasoning to taste

Wrap leeks in ham and layer in an ovenproof dish.

Make cheese sauce and pour over the ham and leeks.

Sprinkle with remaining cheese and a few crumbled crisps or cornflakes.

cook in slow oven for 20 minutes.

Can be made earlier and warmed through.

Good served with wholemeal toast.

As a Christmas alternative, instead of leeks and ham, try white cooked turkey meat with broccoli spears.

BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of main matters discussed at November meeting

<u>Present</u> - All elected councillors - Councillor Sparkes in the chair.

1. Chief Inspector Lanham, accompanied by P.C. Watkinson called by invitation to discuss matters about which the Council remained unsatisfied after the last month's meeting. They promised to give attention to the question of speeding in the village by alerting the traffic police to the problem. In regard to misuse of the bus shelters, P.C. Watkinson would give this his attention but the best remedy would be in catching offenders in the act and reporting them to the Dereham police.

The Chief Inspector welcomed the co-operation of residents in the village and outlined the advantages to be gained by mutual co-operation.

In case of need, Dereham Police can be contacted on Dereham 693451.

2. The question of a budget was held over to the next meeting so that figures coald be prepared in advance.

3. It was agreed to accept the D.C.'s quote of £440 for maintenance of the Recreation Ground next year.

4. <u>Recreation Committee</u>. Councillor Holmes reported a profit of over £200 from the Hallowe'en Dance and expressed appreciation for the efforts of George Kemp and his team. It is proposed to sell the hall and bowling green sites in the Spring and Mr. Ken Ewing has agreed to offer his services free of charge (other than expenses). Planning permission is, in the meantime, being sought. Plans of the new hall and an estimate of costs are awaited from the architect. The question of grants from all sources is now being explored.

5. It was agreed to seek a valuation of the 'surveyor's land' in Reepham Road before considering a request to buy by a local houseowner.

6. A gang from Highways Dept. is expected in the village in about five weeks time to carry out recommended repairs.

7. There is no official objection to the removal of the 30mpb sign on the B1145 to a site nearer to Bennetts Garden Centre but this has to await a traffic order.


