



Mr.F.Reardon - 1 house at Rose Cottage, Reepham Road. Council objected as the new house would be in front of the present Jasmine and Rose cottages. Design considered out of keeping with the area. Problems with access. (Councillor Eglington declared an interest and did not vote).

Mr.S.Perkins - House and garage on the Billingford Road. Opposed as outside the building line and the plot is, in any event, too small. (Again, Councillor Eglington declared an interest and did not vote).

Mr. & Mrs. Battley - Village Stores extension. It was agreed that the village gets a superb-service from the Stores and the proposed extension was welcomed by the Council.

Other matters discussed

The powers of the parish council to affect planning decisions. It was generally agreed that, regrettably, the council has virtually no powers to affect the ultimate decision of the district planning committee, which usually supports the views of its planning officers. Regret was expressed at the changing style of the village and the disappearance of the old brick and flint styling. Our only voice at district committee meetings was that of our representative, councillor David Sayers. Speeding in the village. Looking ahead the club have arranged a farm walk, a tennis evening and a visit to the Splash at Sheringham, amongst other things before the summer break.




