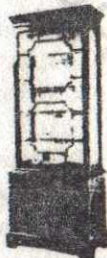

Mr.F.Reardon - 1 house at Rose Cottage, Reepham Road. Council objected as the new house would be in front of the present Jasmine and Rose cottages. Design considered out of keeping with the area. Problems with access. (Councillor Eglinton declared an interest and did not vote).

Mr.S.Perkins - House and garage on the Billingham Road. Opposed as outside the building line and the plot is, in any event, too small. (Again, Councillor Eglinton declared an interest and did not vote).


