



#### REMINDERS.

In view of our absence from circulation for the past two months, due to the holiday break, you might like to be reminded of one or two local services and problems that could affect us all.

- 1. Prescription service. If you find it difficult to get to the Flmham surgery for repeat prescriptions you can leave your prescription form at the Willows before mid-day on any Mednesday and collect the prescribed items from the village stores after 4.00 p.m. on the following Friday.
- 2. Stray Dogs. Pogs allowed to wander freely can be a menace to themselves and to people in the village. Please ensure that your dog is walked on the streets on a lead and causes no nuisance; also that it is kept securely when at home.
- 3. Motor Cycles. The council has received complaints that motor cycles are using the Street, Bawdeswell as a race-track, especially late in the evending. The police have been alerted and if anyone can get the number of an offerding vehicle, they should advise a councillor - or report the matter direct to the police.
- 4. Bawdeswell Heath. As we have reported significant preveously, the "eath is a valued amenity not to be abused by vandals. The owners of a Tricity Fanfare Cooker dumped on the Heath in the last few days might like to know that they were ill advised in leaving the serial number attached; steps are being taken to trace the name and address from the makers. He/she might think it an advantage to remove the cooker to a tip before enquiries are complete rather than face prosecution.

#### A NEW IMITIATIVE FOR THE CHURCH.

Regular churchgoers will be aware that a bold new initiative has been taken by the Bishop of Morwich, summarised in the booklet, 'Moving Forward'. This places an entirely new emphasis on the church in the way it is to be run in future, in each parish and diocese, with greater responsibilities on members of the congregation.
