Dear friends,
Autumn is a time of taking stock, enjoying Harvest and preparing for the future. Nothing can thrive if things are left to stand still. While this is true in the garden and on the farm it also has a very real message within the life of the Churah as well. Within our own diocese, the Bishop of Norwich has called upon every Christian to be part of the strategy he has called "Moving Forward". The Bishop's address, centering the Church's life on Mission rather then maintenance, was delivered at a Diocesan Synod earlier in the year. It received a standing ovation at the time but its suceess depends on whether individual Christians in parishes like ours are prepared to study Bishop Peter's words, and act upon them. The Bishop of Lynn, the Rt. Rev. David Bentley has been asked by Bishop Peter to chair a working group who will be in close contact with the parishes as they face up to "Moving Forward". (copies of the Bishop's address are available if you would like to read his words for yourself).

Bishop David has already written to remind us that "mission and ministry"are at the heart of Christian discipleship, end all who value the name Christian must be pert of "moving forward".

The Church councils and congregations of Bawdeswell and Foxley will be giving the Bishop's words careful consideration in the coming months and I hope you will feel able to be a part of the process by sharing in our worship and our praying.

Clerks Report - A reply has been received from the Police regarding speeding through the village and they hope that their presence has brought some improvement. Breckland D.C. is holding a Parish Conference on 19th September in Watton.

Any Other Business - The Chairman raised a point concerning the new computerised method of issuing medical supplies. Councillor Holmes explained the collection service for these supplies: see "Reminders" elsewhere in this issue.

A parishioner complained of continued speeding and noise from motor cycles and was advised to report the matter immediately to the police when the offence occurs. Another complaint was the reduced visibility when turning into the Reepham Road from The Street, caused by overgrown hedging on two properties. The Clerk will write to those concerned asking for the hedges to be cut back.

A further nuisance is caused by stray dogs and a notice is to be placed in The Reeve's Tale in an effort to encourage more co-operation from the owners of the offending animals.
An increase in the number of low-flying planes in the area has been noticed. On a previous occasion Councillor Wright received comprehensive information from the Ministry of Defence after complaining about this nuisance and she is willing to lend this correspondence to any interested parties.

The next meeting will be on Monday, 2nd October.
