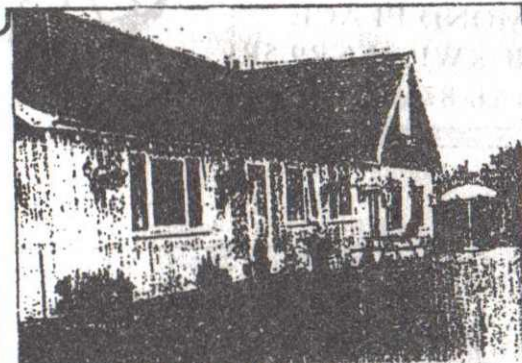

W POTTER, M.K. DE'ATH (PARISH CLERK)
AND 6 PARISHIONERS

MATTERS ARISING:

SEWERAGE: Anglian Water apologise for delay and expect to start the pumping station some time in July. Mr Murrell attended a meeting dealing with water quality, which in this area is low in nitrates and rich in iron. It is confirmed to have the lowest nitrate level anywhere round Norwich.

GRASS CLOGGING DRAINS:

Complaints have been received of grass cuttings clogging drains. Please sweep cuttings away from drains.

MAIL DELIVERIES

Nothing can be done as we live in a rural area. Clerk to write and ask if collection times are consistent with Box Token times.

SIGNING OF EVENTS

Norfolk County Council is under a legal obligation to remove signs since they are illegal. Small direction signs are allowed with permission from N.C.C. Area Engineer will be happy to receive your application on Norwich 223406.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

There will be no speed humps in the Street but direction signs requested will be dealt with as soon as possible.

TREE STUMPS AND STONES ALONG THE HIGHWAY

It was requested that these be removed as they cause a hazard for cyclists and cars.

2 COTTAGES, THE STREET

Parish Clerk to write to Mr Woodward asking him to clear the Highway area in the front of his property. 14 days have been given for him to comply. If there is no response we must take further action.

ELECTRICITY POWER CUTS

The following facts were supplied by Eastern Electricity. Over 12 months the records show (1) Three supply failures due to damage to over head network, (2) Three supply failures due to gales and winds. (3) 1 prearranged shutdown on the 26th Sept for 8 hours for new work. New transformers have made some improvement. Fence and Verge reinstated, satisfactory - no further action is necessary.

SUMMARY OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
HELD 2ND JULY 1930 AT BAWDESWELL P C SCHOOL

PRESENT: Cllrs. Sparkes (Chairman), Farthing, Holmes, Wright
E Eglington, Smith and Battley. District Councillor
Mr Sayer. Mr R Hendry, Mr Camden and Mr Long.
The Clerk and 10 Parishioners.

MINUTES: The minutes of the June meeting were taken as
read, agreed and signed.

MATTERS ARISING:

1. Cllr. Battley provided current information on Bylaugh Lodge, Dereham Road entrance. After a meeting of all property owners concerned, gates are to be erected allowing those vehicles on authorised business and those on foot to enter the wood. Official notices are to be put up declaring the land PRIVATE, with no entry signs for unauthorised traffic.
2. Cllr. Smith has applied for 15 trees for the west bound side of the Recreation Ground and perhaps 1 or 2 for the village sign area.

PLANNING

1. 3/90/84/CU - Mr Long and Mr Camden, owners of three garage/Kelly's Kitchens in Blofield, Wisbeach and King's Lynn, have applied for planning permission to build a Petrol/Service Station on land adjoining Park Farm, Fakenham Road. They were asked if in the long term the service station would replace the garage and workshop already sited in the Village Street. Mr Camden stated that it would and that the present garage site would be developed in accordance with the original plans. Mr Camden and Mr Long are involved with the present garage site to safe guard their future plans.

The Chairman stated that main points should be submitted to the application:

1. Only a petrol station should be erected on the site.
2. Village Garage site to be referred back to previous dwelling application.
3. Highway query regarding flow of traffic on A1076.

Cllr. Holmes proposed and Cllr. Farthing seconded the motion that planning permission be granted, provided that when the new service station opens the existing garage is closed and that the highways are in agreement with the development.

2. 3/90/821/F - A G Bramley - Mayes Cottage, The Street. Erection of a brick and flint wall to match existing wall - 1.1m high - no objections.

PROVISIONAL PLANNING:

Mr R Hendry, builder, put forward a proposal to build 8 dwellings and convert 3 small cottages in Reepham Road. All were in favour of this development which meets a long term need in the village for rented accommodation. Mr Sayer, District Councillor, was asked to put our case to the Council.

CLERKS REPORT:

Water on Elsing Lane - Highways will arrange an inspection at next 10 week routine check.

Football Club increase in donation - a letter received from Mr P Duffield proposes that rent should not be increased by more than 5% in any one season; Clerk to reply.

The AGM of N.P.F.A. is being held on 5th July at County Hall Norwich - No one was interested in attending.

Foxley F.C. have asked if motor cycles are allowed on the Heath, Bawdeswell. Mr O'Ryan who was present gave a strong negative reply, saying motor cycles are not allowed. Much damage is done to the turf by the cycles. Vandal-resistant signs and barriers are shortly to be erected, thanks to a grant from Swanton Morely Charities.

Clearing of dead wood and tidying of trees on the Dereham Road will shortly take place; details will be posted in the Reeves Tale.

Anglian Water invited the 9 parishes served by Foulsham Water Tower to a meeting at the Old Brewery House, Reepham. The Chairman and the Clerk attended.

A full report on the meeting at Old Brewery House can be seen in the full minutes upon request.

MINUTES CONTD.

RECREATION REPORT:

1. The Air Show at Swanton Morley raised £280 and Mary Farthing must be thanked and congratulated on her efforts at her tombola stall.

A Solicitors bill for the aborted sale to Mr Davidson has been received.

There has been no progress on locating a second-hand building but Mr Heath, Chief Executive of Breckland has promised help.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

A complaint has been received about dogs fouling the playing field. Cllr. Smith suggests placing a list of byelaws at the entrance. Clerk to make enquiries about the legalities of byelaws etc.

HALL ROAD DEVELOPMENT

Mr Rogers has put up barriers to prevent vandals from getting onto the development area, this also prevents people from taking short cuts from Hall Road to Paradise Lane. Mrs Riseborough spoke on behalf of parents who queried the right to do this, as it also prevents taking a short cut to the School and shops in the Street. She also complained about bad language being used by labourers on the site. Another complaint was that a tractor was being driven to fast causing a danger to children and adults alike. Cllr Holmes will speak to Mr Rogers and Cllr Sparkes is to query the legal position with the planners.

Miss Joice reported that the post of Head teacher at the school has been advertised and a new Head would be appointed for January 1991. Mrs Drury remains acting Head. School Sports Day was a huge success.

200 CLUB DRAW:

The 4th draw of the 200 Club was made and the result will be published in the Reeves Tale.

Their being no further business the meeting closed at 9.15pm. The next meeting will be on Monday 3rd at 7.30pm Bawdeswell School.
