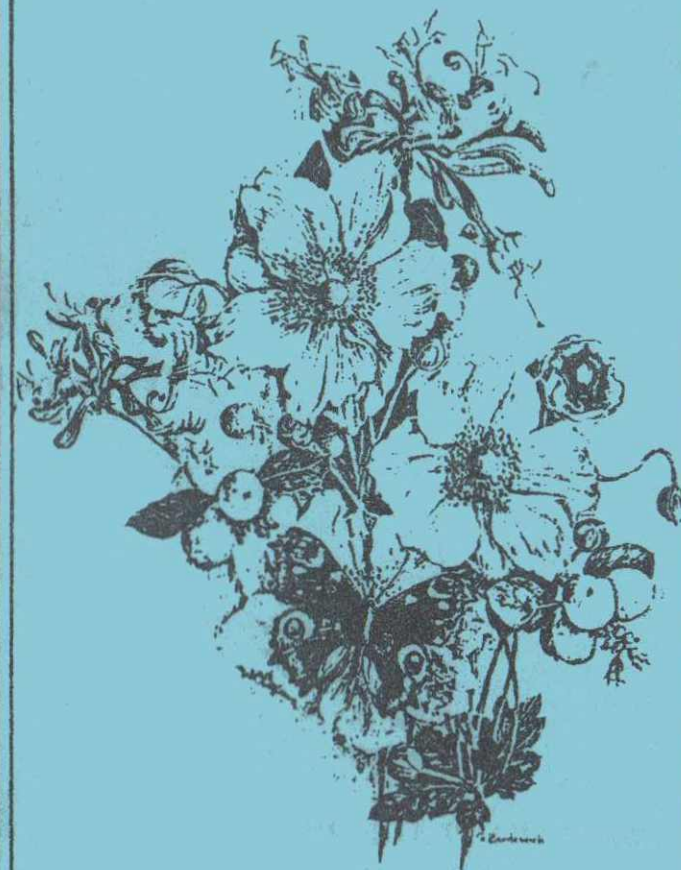

STOP PRESS

We have just learned that at the meeting of Bawdeswell Parish Council on 2nd July, a planning application for a Garage to be built on the by-pass will be considered. As this may well lead to the relocation of the Garage at present in The Street, the matter should be of public interest and residents are welcome at the meeting.

INDIAN COOKING. Khageea (spiced scrambled egg)
Preparation time 6 minutes.
Cooking time 10 minutes.

1 onion, peeled and chopped.
3.0 ml (2 tblsp) oil.
2.5 ml ($\frac{1}{2}$ tsp) chilli powder.
1.25 ml ($\frac{1}{4}$ tsp) turmeric powder.
1 green chilli, chopped.
2 sprigs fresh coriander leaves, chopped.
2 fresh tomatoes, chopped.
Salt to taste.
15 ml (1 tblsp) water.
4 well beaten eggs.

Fry onion in oil for 2 minutes. Add spices and green chilli and coriander leaves, stir fry for 1 minute. Add chopped, fresh tomatoes, season with salt and sprinkle with water. Add beaten eggs. Cover and cook on gentle heat for 6-7 minutes. Stir and mix egg over gentle heat. Khageea should look like spiced scrambled eggs. Serve with parathas for any meal, including a hearty breakfast. Just a change from the usual breakfast!

SUMMARY OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

HELD 4 JUNE 1990 AT BAWDESWELL SCHOOL

PRESENT: Cllr's Sparkes (Chairman), Wright, Holmes, Eglington, Smith, The Clerk & 3 Parishioners.

MINUTES: The minutes of the previous meeting were taken as read and agreed. Signing of the Minute Book will be carried out when it is returned from the Auditors.

MATTERS ARISING: Cllr. Smith asked if enough force had been put into our objections concerning the new dwelling to be built beside the entrance to the Recreation Ground. All criticism had been relayed to Breckland Council.

A number of complaints concerning the Telephone Kiosk have been received. There has been no reply from British Telecom concerning the resiting of the Kiosk.

The hedge at Barn Cottage has been cut down and Mr Thompson of Beech Cottage will deal with his hedge shortly.

CLERKS REPORT: From 1 April '90, a charge of £8.63 will be made by Midland Bank for their safe custody service.

The playing field maintenance contract this year is £477.32. It was agreed to approach the Football Club for an extra donation towards costs. say £100.

PLANNING: Amended plan for Non illuminated shop signs at Bawdeswell stores - No objections.

Refurbishment and Extension including rebuilding garage at Pinetree Cottage, The Drift - No objections.

Extension to dwelling at South View, The Street - No objections.

BOTTLE BANK: Waste Recycling Ltd. are unable to pay for glass collected, but continue to offer a free collection service. It was agreed to keep the bottle bank for the present.

PROPOSED PLAY AREA: A plan has been received from Mr Rogers. The Clerk will make enquiries to rent etc. Cllr. Smith will meet representatives from N.P.F.A. to discuss the possibility of help and advice on equipment for the play area or

Recreation Ground.

NEW COUNCIL MEMBER: The Chairman proposed and Cllr. Holmes seconded that Mr A Battley, Bawdeswell Stores, be co-opted onto the Parish Council - Mr Battley accepted and joined the ranks.

SHAVERS FARM ENTRANCE: The Chairman received a complaint about the water laying on the road at the entrance to Shavers Farm. Highways will be notified.

THE BUS SHELTER: (The Street). There have been two offers to repair the shelter at around a cost of £120. However, Mr Johnson, Builder on Reepham Road has agreed to do the work for a negligible cost.

BYLAUGH WOOD: Late night visitors are causing annoyance to households at the Bawdeswell entrance to Bylaugh Wood, a "NO ENTRY" sign has been erected, without authorisation, in an attempt to stop the annoyance. The Forestry land owned by Mr D Q Gurney and leased to the Forestry Commission is a PRIVATE RIGHT OF WAY. The police are to be informed of the activities in the wood. No action would be taken unless the Landowners wished the Council to assist, as this land is outside Bawdeswell Parish.

RECREATION REPORT: Cllr. Holmes visited the Hall at Taverham, which cost £100,000. It would be possible to convert a similar structure to a Village Hall. Mr Wheeler, Norfolk Rural Community Council, said no grant would be forthcoming this year, and in any case not until more cash had been raised by the Parish. More fund raising events are planned. We are in a stale-mate situation regarding the sale of the Village Hall and garage sites. Cllr. Holmes has written to Mr Heath, Chief Executive of Breckland District Council, appealing for help in locating a secondhand portable building for use as a temporary measure.

3RD DRAW OF THE 200 CLUB : Results to be published in July addition of Reeves Tale.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.00pm.

The next meeting will be held Monday, 2nd July at 7.30 in Bawdeswell School, The Street.


