The Committee has held two meetings during the summer months, to consider various possibilities in respect of the proposed sale of the present village hall and bowling green sites. It will be recalled we have planning permission for three houses to be built but only in conjunction with a development at the same time, of the garage next door. There are now two possibilities:- possibilities.

1. The owners of the garage are hoping to receive planning approval to move to a new site on the by-pass: this is still being considered by the authorities. If successful they will be willing to sell the present garage site for housing development, we shall also be free to do so.
2. There is a proposal to sell our sites to an association for development of starter homes, irrespective of the sale of the garage. This is under discussion with the planning authorities at present.

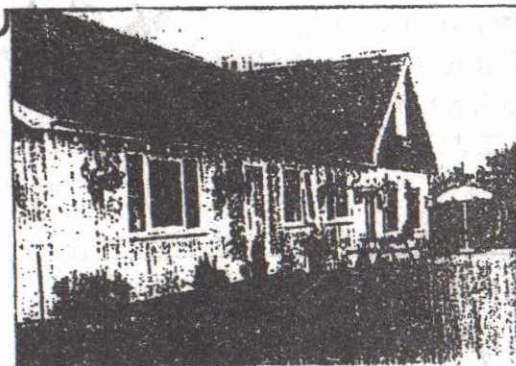

LIST OF MATTERS DISCUSSED

Present: Cllr. Sparkes (Chairman), Farthing, Wright, Eglinton and Pattley. The Clerk and 2 parishioners.

Apologies were received from Cllr Holmes and Smith.

CLERKS REPORT:

- Planning:**
1. **The Old Rectory:** Non-illuminated sign at junction of 1067 and The Street.
 2. **Silver Jubilee:** 2 non-illuminated signs on Norwich Road.

There were no objections on either of the above plans

NCAPTC: Invitation to a meeting in Swaffham on 31st October.

POLICE: Priorities for 1991 - earlier publicity be given locally about crimes in the area to help jog memories. Invite Community Policeman to the Parish Council Meetings.

BOTTLE BANK: NCAPTC to claim payments on our behalf which the County Council pay £1 per tonne for.

STREET NUMBERING: "The Birches" and "Corner House" will now be numbered 35A Hall Road and 37A Hall Road respectively.

BAWDESWELL HEATH: Breckland confirm that 3 Beech trees on the Dereham Road are to be removed because they are diseased and potentially dangerous. Young trees will be planted to replace them.

TREE PRESERVATION ORDER: An order was granted on 30th July 1990 covering the walnut tree on land adjoining Cannon Cottage on the Reepham Road.

PARADISE ROAD/HALL ROAD RIGHT OF WAY: N.C.C. Confirm there is no public right of way at this point, Rogers Development have agreed a footway link which will be adopted by the Authority.

FOOTWAY PARADISE ROAD/DEREHAM ROAD: Highways are to review all earlier request for a footway.

BUCKINGHAM PALACE GARDEN PARTY 1991: Cllr. Sparkes' (Chairman) will be put forward for the draw. Four Chairmen from Norfolk will be invited to attend.

RECREATION REPORT: Planning application for a petrol station has been deferred until Monday 10th September. Cllrs. Sparkes and Holmes will attend.

Mr Elsdon has lifted the remains of the gate from his gateway to be put at the entrance of the recreation ground. Repairs will be carried out by E.R. Eglinton Ltd.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

Mr Lerski, has requested to graze his goats at the gravel pit, Reepham Road. The matter is to be held in abeyance till the site is sorted out.

Complaints: Overhanging trees near the Garden Centre are causing problems to pedestrians. Chairman will discuss matters with the owners.

Children are scattering bales of straw in Common Lane. See Village Briefs.

Events at Old Rectory causing nuisance after midnight. Clerk to enquire if late night licence is necessary.

Notice Board in Hall Road Area: Requests have been made for a second notice board in the village for public notices and other events to be published.

Cemetery Maintenance: The untidy state of the cemetery was reported, this has now been rectified.

Flowers to bloom in Spring! Cllr. Battley to plant daffodils around the village sign. It is hoped this will be appreciated by all in the village.

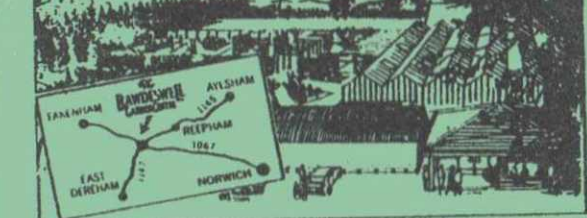
