Any Other Business

The Chairman suggested that the refund from Breckland (see Finance) be used to tidy up Adams Pit in readiness for B.K.V. competition. Cllr. Smith pointed cut that part of mature hedge, including trees, needed to be lowered if it was hoped to reinstate a proper pond. Cllr. Holmes wondered if the Community Services already involved in the churchyard maintenance would be interested in the job. Cllr. Holmes will contact Mr. Scowen at County Council, Nigel Curtis, etc. and report back next month after advice has been sought. Cllr. Battley thought the matter should be more widely discussed in the village because of the proximity to the Paradise Road estate and the possible dangers of children and water.

Foxley Street is to be closed for 12 weeks in order to lay sewer pipes.

Cllr. Farthing reported a continuous leak from a drain in Hall Road. Clerk will notify Water Authority.

A parishioner queried the eventual future of the new houses on the Village Hall site. It has not yet been decided if these starter homes will be for sale or to let but they will fill a great need in the village for cheap housing.

With election of a new council due in May, Cllr. Holmes proposed that each member should approach at least one parishioner in an attempt to encourage more people to put their names forward for this not particularly unpleasant or arduous task. The Chairman agreed it was a good idea; if 14 or more candidates submit their names, parishioners will choose the members by their votes at the election.

There being no other business, the meeting closed at 8.20 pm. The next meeting will be a week later than usual on 8.4.91.
