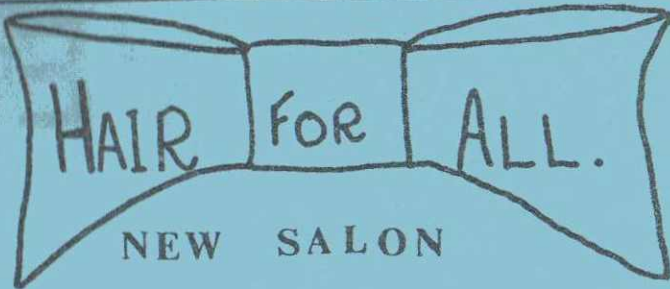

Dear friends,

I'm always on the look-out for catchy slogans and to this end I keep my eye on the notice board outside Chapelfield Road Methodist Church on Norwich's inner ring road between Grapes Hill and St. Stephens Street roundabouts. A typically thought provoking sentence covered the Christmas period just recently, - "Jesus the reason for the season". Often the message lies in the spelling and that was true some time ago when the board read simply "Love Won Another".

A lot has been written and said about all the major churches in Britain recognising these final years of the Twentieth Century as "The Decade of Evangelism". Probably because of a misconception of what Evangelism is, many people both inside and outside the church's life find the idea misleading and possibly threatening. This is a pity because christians are called upon always to give reason for the hope that is in them - in other words to quite naturally share their faith by words and actions. Jesus not only commissioned his first followers to go with the message of his love for all people, it is a commissioning which is applicable to all who trust in Him.

Far from presenting a threat, simple and straightforward faith sharing should be the intent and purpose of all who trust in Jesus, and that's where that catchy slogan comes in; words without love, care and concern will have little effect. Present: Chairman and 4 Councillors, D. Sayer (B.D.C. rep.)

Matters Arising:

Church Hedge: Nothing to date; awaiting action by Highways Department.

Highways: Awaiting action on rubbish clearance in layby A1067. Clerk to telephone.

Street Lighting: Our grant will not be affected. Approximate cost is £200 per light and £9 per year upkeep. Clerk to write to Electricity Board to confirm cost and fixing in location and to ask for types of lamps available. A letter will be sent to residents living near the lamps asking for their views.

Tree Planting: No planting of trees in the area behind bus shelter as an Air Valve is in the vicinity. Another position to be discussed at next meeting.

Memorial: Nothing to report to date.

Two Cottages, The Street: The enforcement Officer has visited and written to the owner.

Reeves Tale: Printing was not up to standard and the Editor has obtained a photocopier. Foxley have been approached by Bawdeswell Parish Council and asked to contribute towards the cost. We are not at this time prepared to make a donation.

Vacancy for Parish Clerk: Mr. Tony Cook will make enquiries. An advertisement will be posted to Notice Board.

Billingford Bridge: To be closed for 16 weeks. This will create a lot of problems. Norfolk County Council surveyors have been asked to build a Bailey bridge but this has been refused. Foxley Parish Council will give its support. Clerk to write to Mr. Rusholme, N.C.C. County Hall.

Audit: Invoice for Coopers & Lybrand professional fees £61.62. Mandatory fees - cheque signed.

Planning:

C. J. Hough - Refused by Breckland District Council.

Sign for Silver Jubilee refused by Breckland Dist. Council.

Sign for The Gamp refused by Breckland Dist. Council.

B. Vine, Westfield, Chapel Road: permission granted by B.D.C.

Mr. Davis is to appeal against his refusal by B.D.C. Clerk to write to Dept. of Environment that Foxley Parish Council support the original decision of Breckland Dist. Council on the grounds that we do not support residential!

Contd.....

We have no need of additional housing in Foxley at this time. We already have access and sewerage problems and the area is outside the guidelines. A copy of Appeal decision is requested.

Planning Item: Sindalls Development, Old Fakenham Road. A parishioner queried what the original planning was for; a bungalow was refused in 1988. Mr. Smith applied and was refused. He tried again and permission was granted for a 1½ storey house; now a 2-storey house has been built. Council unanimous that we and planners were hoodwinked.

Village Hall Grant: Proposed by T. Cook, seconded by C. Skinner, that Parish Council donates funds towards replacement windows and doors for the Village Hall. P.C. will donate remainder of funds in hand after everything is settled at the end of the financial year in March - approx. £350. Village Hall Committee is applying for separate grants from District and County.

Recycling Waste Products: We have no need of this in Foxley.

Mail Delivery: Clerk monitored delivery times for two months and mail was delivered within the time stated by the Post Office.

Any Other Business:

Memorial: Suggestion for wreath on memorial is to be considered next year.

Sewerage: Letter to Anglian Water requesting gate and hardstanding as promised in 1989 in Deed of Sale.

Clay Shoot Surveyors Land: Request for use of land for clay shooting: Proposed T. Cook and seconded by C. Skinner, for approximately 10 times per year - 2 hours once a month. Strict safety will be observed. Those concerned will consult with stable owners. There will be no shooting on Sunday mornings. There were three votes in favour.

The next meeting will be on 8th February, 1991.

PORTAKABIN FUND RAISING PROJECT

PROGRESS REPORT

Since we started this project last Summer we have now raised £2,500, having received £100 from Bernard Matthews, £500 from Anglia Television Telethon Trust and £500 pledged from Marks & Spencers once we reach our target. The remainder of the money coming from our own fund raising events and kind donations from residents of Bawdeswell and Foxley. Our final target is £10,000 which still seems a long way away, but we have been advised that when we achieve one third of our target there are certain grants that will be available to us. So, as you can see, things are really forging ahead and hopefully by the Summer we would have been able to make practical moves towards the siting of the new Playgroup premises.

We get asked from time to time why it is so important for us to have our own premises in Bawdeswell, and why not be content using the Foxley Village Hall. I would, therefore, attempt to explain our thoughts on this matter.

Location. It would be more convenient for many reasons for the playgroup to be located at the centre of the larger of the two villages it serves. It is also agreed that the ideal location of any playgroup is alongside the Infant & Primary School it is linked to.

Premises. The advantages of having a purpose built premises for the Playgroup are far too many to mention. I am sure you can appreciate how wonderful it would be not to have to clear away all the equipment after each session and for the children to be able to display their work on the walls of their own playschool. Although we are extremely grateful to Foxley for the use of their Village Hall, it is rather large for a Playgroup and even though we manage to utilise the space it has meant that for the winter months we have run at a loss due to rather large heating costs.

I hope this helps explain why we feel so strongly about providing our Playgroup with decent premises on the best site possible and I do hope you will continue to give us your valued support.

MINUTES OF JANUARY 1991 BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

PRESENT - All Councillors, the Clerk and two parishioners.

MINUTES - Minutes of November meeting taken as read, agreed and signed.

MATTERS ARISING - Three litter bins have been purchased and are waiting to be fixed at the Post Office and both 'bus shelters.

FINANCE - Predicted expenditure for the year to 31st March 1992 was discussed. The clearance of the Old Surveyors land by Mr Curtis, with the intention of preserving it as a conservation area, was considered to be an unnecessary expense at the moment. The clearance of Adams Pit in Paradise Lane is desirable, but Cllr. Smith proposed and Cllr. Farthing seconded the proposal that no money be set aside for this project in this financial year. Other large payments include Mr D.Q. Gurney's £500 interest free loan (to be passed to Village Hall fund) and playing field maintenance of £520. Cllr. Smith proposed and Cllr. Farthing seconded that the precept be the same as last year i.e. £2,500. All in favour. It was proposed by Cllr. Wright and seconded by Cllr. Farthing that a donation of £500 be made to the Village Hall fund. All in favour. A quotation received from Mr Johnson of £88 plus V.A.T. to erect the gates at the entrance of the Recreation Ground was accepted. This will hopefully deter dogs, motor cycles and unauthorised vehicles from entering the ground and will be invaluable when building eventually commences. Payments made since the last meeting - Breckland District Council for emptying wheelie bin part year £17.63 (cheque no. 964104); P.C. Meeting posters £1.75 (cheque no. 964105); Coopers & Lybrand amended audit fee £81.91 (cheque no. 964106); Lotteries registration £12.50 (cheque no. 964107); purchase of 3 litter bins £129.13 (cheque no. 100051).

After some discussion it was proposed that we enter this year especially now that litter bins are being installed and everyone made aware of the state of the village. More publicity needed as date of judging nears.

RECREATION REPORT - Cllrs. Holmes and Battley have seen a model of the proposed development for the V.Hall/Bowling, Green site and gave enthusiastic support. In the event of permission being granted negotiations still have to be made with the Housing Association as to price. The "200 Club" is again running with 20 tickets remaining unsold, and will be available for further draws

ANY OTHER BUSINESS - The Gospel Hall - New Trustees have been appointed. Details on village notice board.

School Report - School Governor Miss Margaret Joice stated the new Headmaster Mr Shreeve has taken over and it is expected that all will now run smoothly at the School.

There being no other business the meeting ended at 8.35 p.m. The next meeting will be at 7.30 p.m. on Monday 4th February 1991.

CORRESPONDENCE

Extracts of letter received by Mrs. M. Curson of Rainbow Cottage, Bawdeswell, from Mrs. I. E. Floering Blackman of Mowles Manor, Etling Green, Dereham, concerning the temporary closure of Billingford Bridge.

If the County Council had had the resources, it might have provided a bailey bridge at a cost of £95,000, in addition to the sum of £360,000 it will be spending on the demolition and rebuilding of the present bridge. Alas, the Council has no provision for such extra expenditure and in view of the pressures on the Highway Department's budget a bailey bridge is not something for which funds can be made available.

The Council has recently embarked on a huge bridge reinforcement programme countywide to meet the requirements of current legislation and the Billingford bridge is high on the list. The condition of the bridge (which is an unusual structure and the only one of its kind in Norfolk) is a cause for serious concern, to the extent that it is being inspected at very frequent intervals to ensure that it has not reached a state where it would have to be closed to traffic as a matter of urgency. Clearly, as the Surveyor has stated, if the bridge had to be closed for safety reasons before the work of replacing it could begin in earnest the length of closure would be even greater. In effect, the Council really has no alternative but to proceed with the work as quickly as possible in order to minimise the total closure time.....

You mention that Bawdeswell was not consulted about the closure. The Highways Department always seeks the fullest consultation in the time available with those villages most affected by any project, and in this case has consulted fully with North Elmham, Billingford and Worthing. Given that Bawdeswell has easy access to an A class road, it was felt that it would be less affected by the closure and that all the points of concern to Bawdeswell would almost certainly be raised by the three villages most affected.....

Additional signing will be provided at Bawdeswell, Guist and Kings Lynn to encourage through traffic to stick to the A class roads and, with heavy lorries in mind, to avoid travelling through North Elmham. A temporary weight restriction, to be policed by the Chief Constable, will be imposed on the back road through Worthing. The views of the Police, Fire Brigade and Ambulance Service have been sought and, having understood the necessity for the work, the three services have responded positively. The Bus operators have made plans to alter their

routes and timetables. Similar arrangements are in hand for the school bus and the Elmham practice will be given good notice of the date of closure.

.....In view of your concern, I will suggest to the Surveyor that your Council is kept fully in the picture as work progresses.

We are a highly mobile society in rural mid Norfolk and all of us depend on cars and buses to get about and on trucks to deliver goods locally. This dependence places a considerable strain on our highway infrastructure in terms of its maintenance and safety..... The County Council is constrained on the one hand by steadily reducing funds from central government and on the other by the amounts it can reasonably raise through the poll tax. I'm afraid, therefore, we have to live with the closure of the bridge for 16 weeks. I wish it were otherwise. Knowing the resourcefulness of local people I am sure you will cope.....

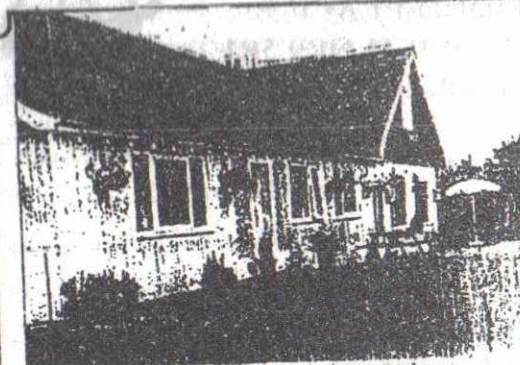
