MINUTES OF A.G.M. HELD IN BAWDESWELL SCHOOL ON TUESDAY 7th MAY 1991 AT 7.30 PM.

PRESENT - Councillors Holmes, Sparkes, Battley, Bramley Strickland, and Curtis the Clerk and 4 parishioners. An apology was received from Mrs Farthing who has been co-opted as the seventh member of the council.

Councillor Sparkes opemed the meeting by welcoming the new councillors and those members of the public attending. He stated that we now own the Recreation Ground and hoped that we would soon be able to hold meetings in a new village hall. It is now a year since we began using the school for Parish Council meetings. The Clerk then invited nominations for Chairman. Cllr. Battley proposed that Cllr. Holmes should take this office. This was seconded by Cllr. Bramley, there being no other nominations Cllr. Holmes was invited to take the chair. It was agreed to hold the election of Vice Chairman until next month when all Councillors are present. The Chairman asked that a vote of thanks be recorded for all the work by the retiring Chairman. Cllr. Sparkes over a period of many years. This was seconded by Cllr. Battley.

MINUTES - The minutes of last years A.G.M. were taken as read agreed and signed. There were no matters arising. Minutes of the April meeting were also agreed and signed.

MATTERS ARISING - Adams Pit- The Chairman, Cllr. Curtis and the Supervisor of the Community Services Group, met on site and discussed the clearance of rubbish etc. from the site. They will be happy to take on the task and hope to begin in a few weeks.

Street naming Hall Road Development - Suggestions so far received: Reeves Walk, Canterbury Court, Canterbury Place and Eglingtons Way or something similar (to commemorate the Eglington family who are leaving the villageafter many generations.) These will be listed in the Reeves Tale and the competition left open for another month.

Community Car Scheme - Little interest so far. We await more volunteers.

FINANCE - First installment of precept and grant have been received from Breckland amounting to £2,036. Balance of account £2,364.36.

Hire of school for meetings has increased to £8.40 Playing Field maintenance contract is £531.39 this year. It was agreed to pay the £500 interest free loan from Mr.Gurney to the Parish Room account as previously arranged. A further donation of £500 will be made on receipt of the remaing precept later in the year. New signatories are Cllr. Holmes, Cllr. C.Sparkes and Cllr. M.Farthing. Clerk will arrange mandate with bank.

The Clerk's salary is to be increased to £590 per annum in line with the recommended fugure from the Assoc. of Town and Parish Councils. This will be paid monthly by bankers order.

CLERKS REPORT- Due to the resignation of Cllr. Smith another councillor is needed to represent the PC on Bawdeswell Heath Committee. Cllr. Nigel Curtis was proposed by Cllr. Sparkes and seconded by Cllr Battley and agreed to hold this position. Planning

Permission granted:

3/90/1610/F N.Curtis Continued use of landscaping Business and formation of access.

3/90/1723/F Orbit Housing Assoc. Low cost housing 5 on the Village Hall site.

New Developments:

3/91/405/F Mr.M.Elsden. Double garage for use with barn conversion. No objections.

3/91/405/F C.& P. Rogers. Erection of 9 two bedroom starter homes, Phase 3, Hall Road.

Concern was expressed regarding access through Hall Road by the extra traffic that will inevitably be produced by extra housing. No speed limit in Hall Road. Not entirely happy with the density of the proposed housing and is there still a need for more starter homes in the village alongside those already in the pipeline?. Also, no play area has yet been agreed. These observations will be passed on to the

Planners at Breckland and the Clerk will contact Mr.Rogers about any progress towards the promised play area.

RECREATION REPORT - The Village hall site has been valued and the Trustees have asked that the property be offered for sale through Ewings of Reepham. No approach yet from Orbit Housing. The Chairman has dealt with minor queries from the Charity Commissioners and has also invited the architect to attend a meeting to discuss ideas, free labour etc. for the new hall.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS- School Report - an apology from Miss Joice who could not attend, but Cllr. Sparkes reported that all is well at the school. The Governors term of office ends next year and Miss Joice will remain our representative until then. Cllr. Battley reported fly-posting on telegraph poles in the village by Fakenham Lions. Clerks will politely request that these are removed after the event, pointing out that as we are entered for the best kept village competition we do not appreciate this activity.

The question of street lighting has again been broached, but it was agreed that there is enough private lighting in most areas, it is to our advantage financially not to have lighting and at the last open meeting on the subject, the village was most definately against installation.

Mr. Mercer queried whether the new development adjacent to the Recreation Ground would prevent a splayed entrance being constructed as originally intended, to facilitate driving out of the gateway. It is hoped eventually to provide an access through from the street through land owned by Mr. Elsden. Concern was expressed about the load on the sewerage system in the Hall Road development. This will be taken into consideration by the planners.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 8.35. The next meeting will be held in the school on Monday 3rd June at 7.30 pm.

## GO VEGETARIAN

Have you ever wanted to try a vegetarian diet, but not known what to put in place of that meat? Well, for several years now the manufacturers of meat products have been using a substance o "stretch" their products that is TOO% vegetable in origin. In other words, many sausages seen in a butchers will contain about one third vegetable protein. Now some enterprising food manufacturers have gone further and produced a whole range of sausages, burgers and other "fake" meat products from this Textured Vegetable Protein or TVP as it is known. There are burger and banger lixes, mince and chunks all much cheaper and ealthier than any meat. TVP is higher in protein than most meat, but it is lower in fat, has no cholestorol and has fewer calories. The really good news is that this new "wonder food" is now available at our local store. Why not try it. Here a couple of recipes that have gone down well with my meat eating family. If you like them give me a call and I'll get a few copies made of a dozen or so recipes for circulation.

## BEEFLESS STEW

large onion chopped.
medium carrots chopped.
medium potatoes cubed.

2 cloves garlic chopped (optional)

2 sticks celery chopped

2 red pepper chopped and deseeded.

2 cozs butter or margarine

I packet TVP chunks (each box of TVP chunks contains 4 packets of chunks - that's 4 meals for £1.55)

I tin tomatoes
I pint stock or water
2 tbsps soy sauce or I dessertspoon of Marmite.
salt and pepper to taste.

Melt the butter and lightly brown the onion. Add the TVP chunks and the prepared vegetables and fry for a few minutes stirring. Add other

ingredients and simmer for 30 to 40 minutes. Check liquid levels half way through and add a little more if it seems too dry. Serve with extra potatoes and green vegetables.

### SHEPHERDS PIL

I large onion chopped.
Istick celery chopped(optional)
2ozs butter or margarine or 4 tbsps oil.
I pkt TVP Mince.
½pt stock or water.
2 tbsps soy sauce or I dessertspoon marmite
2 tbsps tomato puree or ½ tin tomatoes chopped tsp mixed herbs.

Melt butter or oil and gently fry onion and celery until nicely browned - may take I5 mins. Add TVP mince and fry for another few minutes. Add remaining ingredients and simmer until rich and thick. Season well with salt and pepper. Put into a suitable dish. Top with mashed potatoes and brown under the grill. If liked sprinkle the top with a little grated cheese first for a really attractive topping.


