NOTE MEETING DATE PUBLISHED ON NOTICE BOARDS AND AS OPEN TO PUBLIC - NO PARISHIONERS PRESENT.

PRESENT: Cllrs. Murrell, Clarke, Potter, Parnell and Cook. apologies from Cllr Skinner.

REASON FOR MEETING: Precept requirement due by 25/01/91 plus 2 accounts.

COUNCIL INSURANCE: Municipal Mutual -agreed to renew for 1991 at premium of £92.16

C.P.R.E. (NORFOLK SOCIETY): agreed to renew for 1991 at £12.00 (Subscription)

91/92 PRECEPT: Guaranteed income - £296 Lighting Grant plus £48 Credit Balane = £344

'HOUSEHOLD' expenditure comprising clerks salary/ expenses subscriptions, insurances, auditors fee and election expenses (£75 for non - contested) amount to approx £500. The possibility of two street lights would cost approx. £470 to purchase and include the first years running cost/maintenance of £29. Decision on this item to be made by new Council after May 1991. Precept set at £2.80 per head (1990 was £2.50) to give approx. £500 income. This will cover necessary expenditure leaving approx. £350 for other items but not enough for 2 lights. It was agreed that a precept higher than that agreed would not be appropriate at this time.

Final Meeting of this Council - March 22nd 1991.

Meeting of February 8th postponed due to bad weather. To be reconvened as soon as possible - NOTE - Village Hall not available for any Friday up to Easter, we will request to use Silver Jubilee.

Future events include a "Sixties Night Dance" in the Marquee attached to the Old Rectory Restaurant, (by kind permission of Mr & Mrs Peter Pollock) on March 15th, music to be provided as usual by George Kemp. It has indeed been a long drawn out business but despite all the setbacks, the prospect of a new hall WILL be realised if we continue to have goodwill and help of everyone.

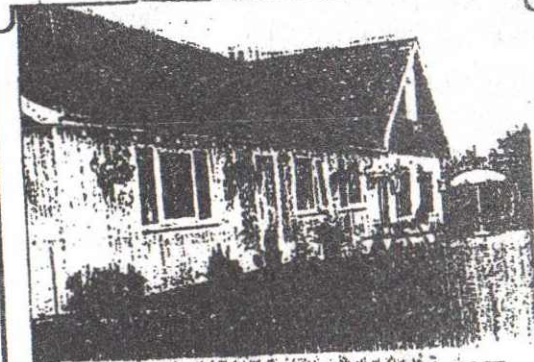
