

Dear Friends,

The plight of the Kurds seemed to dominate April and, as one clergyman I was talking to recently said, it made the first verse of Psalm 121 seem more real than ever - "I will lift up my eyes to the hills, from whence cometh my help?" Someone also commented "where is God in all their suffering?" Perhaps the question needs turning on its head, for God might well be saying "Where are my people that they might help those in need?"

While the situation within Iraq remains a complex and unresolved problem, there could be no doubt in our minds that help was needed, and was needed fast. The swift action of governments was praiseworthy but this alone could not completely relieve the suffering. The aid agencies were looking to ordinary people like you and me in order that they too could make an effective contribution. The United service of Easter Praise on the Sunday following Easter Day in Foxley was a joyous occasion. It gave those of us who believe in the Risen Loard an opportunity to celebrate but also to respond to his commands.

Jesus said "in as much as you did it unto me". Through generous donations at that service £100 has now been sent to the special Iraqi Relief fund being administered by Christian Aid. This alone, of course, is far from enough and I know that many more from the parishes have given and and will continue to give generously.

With Christian Aid week coming soon in the middle of May, please be generous in your support for there is no doubt that "the poor are always with us".





BAWDESWELL PARISH ROOM COMMITTEE

At its meeting on April 10th, the Committee heard from Graham Wright that, although the Housing Association interested in the development of our land had not secured appropriate finance for their scheme this year, it had priority for 1992 and in fact, it may be possible to start in a few months time. We hope shortly to meet the officials to negotiate a price for the five plots. The Charity Commission requires that we advertise the land for sale and obtain a valuation from a qualified Valuer. The Chairman was authorised to approach Ken Ewing for this purpose.

We may be able to obtain some free labour from Wilmot Dixon in the form of apprentices under training; it was therefore agreed that we should try to get planning permission as soon as possible. The Chairman agreed to approach our architect in the first place to see what he can come up with and it is hoped that he will be able to meet the committee soon.

We have been allocated a stall at the Swanton Morley Air Show on Sunday 16th June and Mary Farthing agreed to organise the collection of items for a tombola.

Graham Wright and George Kemp agreed to approach the owners of the Old Rectory Restaurant to see if we can arrange for a dance and possibly a BBQ in the late summer or early autumn.







BAWDESWELL HEATH FUEL AND ALLOTMENT TRUST

I know many families in Bawdeswell and surrounding villages enjoy the heath in all seasons, in particular it was lovely to see so many families enjoying the snow this year, the whole heath rang out with squeals of delight. It's also a haven for dog lovers, a place where man and his best friend can enjoy complete freedom. Best of all it's there to be enjoyed by every one and it's very natural splendour is something to be treasured in these times of development, building and constant change.

The heath is managed by the Trustees, it is a charity which dates back to 1719 the land having been donated and held in Trust. As a charity it has very few resources, relying solely on donations, good will and sales of timber. Perhaps your family would like to dontate a tree to the heath, all help offered would be greatly appreciated.

MAD TEIGORISH

In the olden days fuel from the heath was given to the needy and bracken was used for bedding. Even today Parishioners from Bawdeswell still benifit from this trust, normally a payment is made in the case of Bereavement to the surviving partner.

At a recent meeting of the trustees it was decided to give people of Bawdeswell and others who enjoy this facility the opportunity to help keep the heath in good order. A working party of volunteers would be asked to help out with clearing dead wood and ditches planting trees and bulbs, keeping the heath alive and weel for future generations to enjoy as we all do now.

Perhaps the children from Bawdeswell School would like help with the planting and keep details of new trees planted with the date and growth recorded.

Please do go out and enjoy Bawdeswell Heath but please do not take motorised vehicles or motorbikes onto the heath as this spoils the enjoyment of others and damage the plants and trees.
