





CRIME WATCH

To help prevent crime and to speed up the process of catching anyone who does commit a criminal act in our village CRIME WATCH is about to be launched. This is a simple system devised with the help of P.C. Finney, our local community policeman. When a crime has been committed details will be displayed on posters in the village and circulated on small leaflets with the newspapers within 24 hours of the event. Tf anyone has any information, however trivial it may seem, they are asked to record it on the leaflet. It is not even necessary to add your own name and address although obviously it would The completed leaflet can then be be a help. handed in at Bawdeswell Store, to P.C. Finney at Dereham police station or to a local co-ordinator when these have been appointed. It has been proved that these "Watch" schemes can help to cut crime. If criminals are caught in the act, if rates of detection are high or there is a certainty of being caught then chances of crime lessen so be vigilant and aware of strangers acting suspiciously, unknown vehicles or odd movements around properties normally empty during the day, for example, write down registration numbers or the time you see something out of It can always be forgotten if nothing place. materialises, but in the event of a reported break-in or nuisance being committed YOU will bave information which could speedily catch the offender.

MINUTES OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 2ND MARCH AT 7.30 P.M.

PRESENT Chairman Cllr Battley, Cllrs Sparkes, Farthing, Harrowven, Miners, Bramley, the clerk and 6 parishioners. An apology was received from Cllr. Strickland.

MATTERS ARISING

Street naming - Hall Road Rogers Bros. refused to accept Eglingtons Way for the road on their new development. TWO FIELDS WAY was chosen from names submitted earlier.

Bottle Bank A letter was received from Mr. D. Gurney objecting to the siting of the bottle bank on Norwich Road. Bawdeswell Garage has offered to have the bank. All agreed that this was an ideal position and expressed thanks. Breckland Freestyle hope to bring their slide show to the April meeting. To be confirmed. Street Lighting The cost per light for underground cables is £500. Lights have to be spaced no less than 46 metres apart. Low wattage amber lighting costs approx. £9.50 per light per year, maintenance extra. Therefore to install 20 lights in The Street and Norwich Road would cost £10,000 plus running costs. The Parish Council is totally responsible for the funding, no grants are available.

Speeding in the village especially Norwich Road. Clerk to contact the police again re; speed traps, control etc.

Trees Cllrs. met Mr. Williams from NCC and walked through the village with him suggesting possible planting sites for trees. It was agreed to ask for 5 around the village sign, 3 at the Reepham Rd/Water Lane junction, 5 beside the bus shelter in The Street, about 20 on the bend opposite the school and a few on the opposite corner. It appears that if approved by NCC, Highways, mains services etc., that trees, stakes and guards are all supplied free of charge from NCC as long as the planting is done through volunteer help.

Breckland Tree Planting Sheme is being reintroducd and it was agreed to apply to them also.

Old Surveyors Land Reepham Road the Charity Commission Bill is still awaiting reading through the Commons and is not expected to become law before the election. Mr. Lerski has offered to have legal documents relating to a lease of the land drawn up by a firm of solicitors. Cllr Bramley pointed out that a licence not a lease was required. Cllr Sparkes re stated that the pits ought to be maintained as conservation areas and that Mr. Curtis, the official warden, had cleared the middle of the land during the last 12 months. It was decided to invite Mr. Curtis to a site meeting to discuss the matter again. Planning Permission granted:

3/91/1428 Erection of double garage. 3/91/1444 Revised gable detail on village hall. New application:

3/92/149/F Mr. P. Bennett, New House, Mill Rd, Foxley. Erection of bungalow between 5 & 6 Chaucer Close. No objections.

School Puddle Highways are to be approached again on this matter.

Bridleway across Heath It has been pointed out that horses are not able to enter due to the deep ditch excavated recently to discourage cars. Clerk to speak to Heath Trustees.

Recreation Report Monies from the sale of the old village hall site have been apportioned between the hall fund and the bowling club. Grant also recievd in the sum of £20,000. Work will hopefully begin soon.

Any other business Concern has been expressed by various residents in Chaucer Close and Bell Close over the erection of a large greenhouse on a concrete base on a piece of land adjoining the site recently purchased by the Garden Centre. It is understood that planning permission has not been sought but is needed for this building. Breckland D. C. will be asked to enforce these regulations. Another complaint is the eye-sore and noise in high winds caused by the stacking system of composts along the boundary hedge. Advice will be sought from the environmental health department.




