MINUTES OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 6th JULY 1992

Present were Cllrs. Battley (chairman), Farthing, Sparkes, Bramley and Strickland the Clerk and 13 parishioners.

The Main Points Raised were:

Seating for the village Three estimates have been recieved, the best from Virgo Joinery so it was agreed to purchase 3 benches to be placed at Adams Pit and beside the village sign.

Garden Centre A letter has been received from Mr. Underwood stating that sections stored on the site are in readiness for the complete rebuilding of the front of the premises (permission granted last year) and expressing dismay at the "negative vibes" he recieves from the community. Clerk replied to the letter adding congratulations for an excellent performance at the Royal Norfolk Show where the Garden Centre won a Large Gold Rosette. Congratulations also to Mr. Framingham who also won an award.

Old Surveyors Land Reepham Road Draft form of not Tenancy Agreement from Hood, Vores & Allwood.

Planning

3/91/1151 Formation of new pond, Dale Farm, Bawdeswell. Application withdrawn.

3/92/46/F Mr. P. Lilwall. Erection of 2 poultry breeding units and bungalow for managers accommodation. Permission refused.

Recreation and Playing Fields Committee are requesting a donation towards the cost of constructing a road to the new Village Hall. This was agreed.

Eastern Electricity have found it necessary to ammend the original route to the new Village Hall. Unfortunately this would appear to go across the childrens play area where the large concrete pipe has been laid.

RECREATION REPORT

The car boot sale made £72.50. A donation pf £5 has been received from Mrs. Coe who lived in the village in 1934.

"Buy a brick" tickets are now available at £1 each. The raffle will be drawn on the opening night of the Village Hall.

PLAYGROUND REPORT 4 swings, some stepping logs, a concrete tunnel, a tyre "nessie" and 2 picnic tables have been installed. Bouncy animals will shortly be added. Grants have been agreed from both Breckland District Council and the Rural District Council and there has been lots of help from parents. (even more would be appreciated!) All the equipment is obviously designed for very young children and is under the height to require a safety surface other than grass.

SCHOOL REPORT Miss Joice reported that the school is in very good heart. The Goveners are about to be changed.

Dogs on the recreation ground. Fouling and nuisance by dogs continues to be a problem. Until the gate is fixed and boundaries "dog-proofed" it is not possible to make and enforce any bye-laws.

Old village hall site Correspendence has been exchanged between Mrs. O'Neill and the Chairman of the PC over the removal of a piece of hedge during the development of the site. The chairman opened the discussion by saying that the PC had no powers in the matter as it does not own the land. Mrs. O'Neill replied that at last years meeting when the plans were discussed, she and Mrs. Adams expressed concern that the hedge was missing from the plans .. They were assured by Cllr. Holmes that the plans were wrong and that he would confirm this. Ms. O'Neill always considered that she owned the hedge and therefore did not feel a need to take out an injunction to protect it. She was then outraged to hear that in her absence the hedge had been removed. The discussion involving most of the people present continued for some time. It was concluded that noone wanted hedges to be removed; that there had been nothing in writing and that there was very little that the PC could do. It was eventually agreed to write to the builder.



PARISH MAPS : PARISH APPRAISALS

Many villages in Norfolk are rightly proud of their village signs. They give the village an identity and reflect its history as well as look A PARISH MAP continues this by good. celebrating the unique and interesting features found in a parish: its buildings, wildlife, landscape, hedgerows, trees, ponds and streams, footpaths, its hidden corners and historical development through a map. But a map can be interpreted in many ways and by using a variety of media from drawings to photographs. The Rural Community Council is keen to encourage the creation of parish maps and has examples from around Norfolk and the country which can be borrowed. Selling copies of your parish map can be a good fund-raiser for village projects.

Is it time to take a 'stockcheck' in your parish? What do parishioners feel about future development? Is there a need for 'affordable' housing? Are there problems that should be highlighted? A PARISH APPRAISAL is one method of helping to answer all these questions and enabling Parish Councils to reflect what parishioners feel and think about THEIR parish. The Rural Community Council is encouraging more appraisals in Norfolk, and can give advice and support as well as the use of a computer programme to help in the process.
