

RECIPE FOR LATTICED HADDOCK

1 packet of frozen smoked haddock 2 oz flour 2 ox butter 1 pint of milk 4 eggs toast

Boil the haddock until cooked. Remove any dark skin. Fut flour and butter in a saucepan and blend together. Add the milk gradually until you have a white sauce Break the eggs into a bowl and stir well. Then tip into an omelette pan in which a little butter has been added. Do not stir at all, shake pan occasionally and wait until egg is cooked through and set. Take off the heat and leave to get cold.

Place the haddock in white sauce in a flat oven-proof dish Cut the egg into strips and lay across the haddock in a lattice design. Put into oven and warm through rapidly. Serve with hot toast.

MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 4TH NOVEMBER

PRESENT Councillors Holmes, Sparkes, Battley, Curtis, Bramley and Strickland. An apology was received from Cllr Farthing. Also present were the Clerk and 6 parishioners.

MATTERS ARISING A letter of thans received from Miss M. Joice Chairman of Governors, Bawdeswell School, for the cheque for £25 sent to Mr. Winterbones retirement fund.

Letter received from Mr.D. Gurney about the chimney of Old Toll House. On inspection he believes it to be safe.

The Chairman suggested Old Bell Loke to Mr. Elsden instead of Meadow Loke but as The Bell is already in use it was agreed that Meadow Loke should stand.

Cllr. Curtis reported a meeting between the architect, Graham Wright and the Bowling Club about siting of the new Bowling Green. It was discovered that the old measurements were used in planning the new Green thus giving rise to the problem. If Breckland Planning Dept. allows the Hall to be moved 15 feet to remedy this.

Cllr Bramley asked about finance for play equipment. Chairman has confirmed budget for the remainder of the year so project can go ahead.

Footpath signs have been erected by Cllr Curtis. A vote of thanks was given.

RECREATION REPORT

The Charity Commission have at last been satisfied that no further information is needed and will eventually authorise the sale of the old Village Hall. The Old Hall building has been sold for £178.00

A grant application has been made to Norfolk Rural Community Council who needed an actual tender not just an estimate for the work. Another application has been made to the Rural Development Commission who would be interested in helping if an additional use be found for the Hall. Mrs Wright prepared an excellent "profile" showing how deprived the village was in comparison with others of a similar size to be sent with this application. The local surgery and Mrs Olley from the Community Health Dept. were approached and both were enthusiastic about the Halls use as a Health Clinic. Other possibilities include Education classes or possibly a day centre.

Village Hall Committee - Mr. D. Gurney is to replace Cllr. Holmes as Chairman ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Clir Bramley asked if the Village sign could be repainted. The Clerk explained that she had already been approached and was more than willing to undertake its renovation if the sign could be taken down. Clir Curtis agreed to "have a go". The Chairman stated that the intention had been expressed to transfer the deeds of the Recreation Ground to the Farish Council who will remain as custodial trustees. The split between the Bowling Club and the Village Hall is to be decided once the sale of the Old Hall has gone through.

Letters of resignation were tndered by Cllr Holmes and Cllr. Curtis both of whom are leaving the Village at the end of November. Cllr Battley then presented the Chairman with a card, two cut glass goblets and several gift vouchers in recognition of his unstinting service to the village over the years that he has been here.

Clir, Curtis is also the Parish Council representative of Bawdeswell Heath trustees. Clir Strickland has offered to take over this role and attend the annual meeting in Hovember.

Just before the meeting ended Mr and Mrs Cooke arrived. They were concerned by the tree cutting being carried out within view of their property by Messrs Harrold. The trees were not listed and permission was granted to cut down 2 of the 3 applied for. He was also told that the hedges have to be replanted along the Reepham Road. They had been removed to facilitate drainage by modern machinery.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 8.35 p.m.

The returning officer will now be notified of the two resignations and notices posted in the village. We will be notified in due course as to whether an election is necessary or whether new Councillors can be co-opted.
