



Planning - Mr J Green, The Hawthorns, Change of use from Private Garage to Carpenters/Joiners Shop - NO OBJECTIONS.

SILVER JUBILEE SIGNS - A letter has been received from enforcement officer Breckland D C stating the sign must be removed within 2 weeks, otherwise prosecution will follow. The clerk was asked to write again expressing Councils concern at Breckland D C attitude, and add in the present economic climate, they fail to understand why they will not allow the sign to remain, this is Mr & Mrs Saker's livelyhood.
