

Recreation report

The auction of promises raised £1,398 after expenses with another £90+ being made on the raffle.

T-shirts and sweat shirts are now available from Bawdeswell Stores, these are in multiple sizes, styles and colours, all with the new village hall logo.

Playground report

The swings and slides have arrived and will be in position by the end of June. Cllr. Harrowven is constructing "tyre play" and also needs telegraph poles.

It was suggested that there should be an official opening for the playground along the lines the the Playgroup event.

School report

It is proposed to establish a wildlife garden along the boundary hedge. The Community Service group will dig out the ditch. A "clockwork sportsday" is to be held at the school this year.

Any other business

Old surveyors land - Reepham Road Mr Lerski has drawn up a licence agreement and it has been submitted to our solicitors for inspection.

Cllr. Farthing reported a noisy drain in Hall Rd.

Cllr. Harrowven referred back to the correspondence regarding the Garden Centre. Residents in Hall Road have reported more aluminium greenhouse sections being delivered. It is suggested that those concerned continue to put their complaints in writin to the Planning Department at Breckland.

Crime P.C. Finney then talked on the subject of crime prevention in the Village.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 8.35 p.m. The next meeting is on Monday 6th July. There is no meeting in August.

A Letter Received by The Clerk to the Parish Council from Mr. D. Gurney, Chairman of the Trustees of Bawdeswell Heath.

"Dear Mrs Curson,

I see from the April edition of the Reeves Tale that at the recent PC meeting a question was raised about the bridle way across Bawdeswell Heath and that you were to speak to the Heath Trustees about the matter.

May I point out that having done extensive research on old maps there never has been a bridle way across the Heath. The bridle way is from the Billingford Road as far as the Heath but does not cross it. There is merely a footpath across the Heath and by tradition over many years, and I need to do more research on this into the Minutes, but certainly way back into my Grandfathers time before the last War, the Trustees have never recognised a bridle way. The Trustees have always collected, or attempted to collect, a small donation from those who wished to ride on the Heath, thus acknowledging there was no right of way on a horse. Therefore, when the Trustees dug out the ditch beside the car parking area they were merely reinstating the ditch as it used to be and the reason for this was to try to prevent motorcyclists from using the Heath as a dirt track. To some extent we have been successful, although I see recently a motorcyclist had been across and therefore the ditch may have to be dug out again. Coupled with this the Trustees are attempting to have the ditch dug out for its whole length to improve the drainage and to restore that part of the Heath which is low lying and boggy to what it used to be years ago.

I should therefore be grateful if the PC would back the Heath Committee in preventing a footpath being used by anybody who wish to ride a horse across it unless they have been given specific permission by the Heath Trustees which has been the custom as I say for 50 years or more."

Bawdeswell Garden Centre Breckland have submitted a file to their solicitors department at Attleborough and will reply in due course.

New footway - Reepham Road following a site meeting between the clerk and Mr. Bushell, Area Engineer, NCC have agreed to surface the footway as far as the entrance of the Recreation Ground.

Village seating Quotations have been received from the Garden Centre and Mr. Myhill. Cllr. Harrowven suggested that Breckland D.C. should be approached to see if they are able to provide cheaper benches.

Bowling Club letter received from Hood, Vores and Alwood regarding proposed status of Club on the Recreation Ground. Chairman stated that the Gren was previously freehold, that the club had co-operated in the deal involving the old village hall site and he believed that when the Club was re-established they ought to be in the same position. Cllr Sparkes pointed out that the new green would be full size and suggested that leasehold was more appropriate. Discussion followed and it was agreed that a 99 year lease be granted at a peppercorn rent.
