November sees the General Synod of the Church of England taking an historic vote on the Ordination of Women to the Priesthood. Wearing my media hat, I know that the media is taking a lot of interest in the way the vote will go on Wednesday 11th November. Because of the way voting is organised on major items of church policy a 2/3rds majority will be needed in the three houses of General Synod - Bishops, Clergy and Laity.

We have all been encouraged by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to pray for God's guidance over the issue. It would be wrong to see the vote, which ever way it goes, as producing winners and losers on the day. I personally value the ministry of women within the churches ordained ministry, several other denominations already have incorporated women into their full time ministry most successfully. I believe my present task isn't to compaign vehemently on one side or the other, but simply to state my own views and make sure our elected representatives at General Synod are aware of our prayers and support. I will be presenting the daily live Pause for Thought spots (at approximately 8.40 a.m.) on Radio Norfolk all that week, so will have my own contribution to make there.

While I hope the vote will be in favour I also know that this looks to be far from certain. The one thing that must be maintained is a positive acceptance of the ministry of both men and women within the work of God's church worldwide.



APOLOGIES: For absence - received from C. Skinner.

PLANNING:

Floranova - General Purpose Building. Stockwood House - Shower Room. permission granted for both of these.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Sign Advertising "The Silver Jubilee" on the main A1067. Clerk had written to to the Chief Planning Officer at Breckland District Council on behalf of the council, expressing their concern at this sign having to be removed. This was needed for people to know as this was a business off the main road, a reply hadn't been received The Clerk had telephoned and was informed there would be an enforcement notice served in due course for the removal of this. The council thought that this was grossly unfair in view of the fact that there are many signs advertising all around the county.

Reviewing of Governing bodies- Bawdeswell School - The Chairman reported Bawdeswell Parish Council had telephoned and said Mr. S. Lees had nominated. OTHER BUSINESS:

Drain in road Foxley street, although was pumped out regularly, Mr Davis thought the actual drain was blocked. Clerk to get in touch with Anglian Water Authority and N.C.C. Highways to find out who is responsible.

LITTER BINS- Breckland District Council has been in touch asking where the litter bins are in the village, they would arrange to empty them- Where are they? Does anybody know?

DIGEST OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 5TH OCTOBER 1992

Present were all Councillors, the Clerk and 2 parishioners.

The Main Points Raised were:

School Governors. It was agreed that Miss Joice would be asked to stay on for the time being until the other new Governors settle in.

Planning. Permission given for a bungalow on the site between 5&6 Chaucer Close. Outline permission for 2 houses at 18 Paradise Road.

Finance. Second installment of precept (£1500) and grant of £500 for Play equipment received.

Police. New liason officer for the village is P.C. Jackson, based at Dereham Police Station.

Recreation report

Total cost of access road to the new Village Hall is over £9000. Some grants awaited but major fundraising drive agreed; any remaining amount will have to be borrowed, so that the building can open as soon as possible.

Playground Report

Bouncy animals will be installed 24/25th October (weather permitting).

Planning Strategy Comments

In view of local concerns about recent planning decisions it was agreed that a strong and detailed reply should be sent to Breckland Planning to help protect the community and environment of the village. The letter will include the following points:

- -Consideration of the community as people, rather than buildings.
- -To avoid large estates and overcrowded sites.
- -To ask for traffic calming and traffic noise protection.

-To stress the positive steps the village is taking to develop the community and recognise that it will grow but that this should be controlled.

Other business

- 1. Insurance. Cover may need to be sought from another company if MMI collapse. It will be extended in due course to cover the Village Hall
- 2.Refuse Collection.Hiccup occurred as new contractor took over on 5th October.Notices were published in the Free Press but the company were unaware that it is not delivered in this area. The Chairman arranged for an extra one off collection to ensure all bins were emptied, and a note will be put in all Newspapers to say that collections will be on Mondays now.
- 3. Parish Council headed notepaper will be designed by Class 3 at the school.
- 4. The Clerk is to obtain a list of preservation orders on buildings in the village as part of the consideration of future planning strategy.

The next meeting is on Monday 2nd September at 7.30 pm in the School.

After the halt-term break we shall be changing to meet on Wednesday afternons only. Our first day back therefore be Wednesday 4th November.




