





DIGEST OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 8th MARCH 1993

(Apologies to anyone who turned up on the 1st March, when the meeting had to be cancelled at the last minute due to lack of heating)

Trees

The grant from Shell U.K.has been spent on some trees along the drive to the Village Hall and a shrub bed opposite the entrance doors. The County Council have given 36 trees for planting around the Village(sites chosen and agreed with Highways).Councillor Wright will collect them from County Hall and volunteers will be needed to plant them. The Tree Warden scheme for aftercare will be discussed next time.

Telephone Kiosk

British Telecom.have now deleted the box from their renewal programme as it is in a Conservation Area. To ensure it is fully protected the Council will apply to have it listed.

Old Toll House

This is another building of historic interest in the village which the Council is keen to preserve and will be investigating the possibility of Listed Building status.

Highways Issues

-It has been confirmed that the footpath to the Village Hall will be made up as part of the new year's programme, which runs from April 1993. -Cat's Eyes. The Reepham Road ones will be replaced, but those removed from The Street/ Old Fakenham Road will not as it is no longer a major road.

-Village Hall signs. Highways have agreed to signs along the Reepham Road to direct traffic/visitors. Planning

Permission sought for the demolition of a garage and shed, and erection of a kitchen at Bridor House Fakenham Road.No objections. Did School Robin Spectran Low Cost Housing

Mr Whittall from Breckland D.C.will be invited to the next meeting to give advice on the most effective way to persue this issue. Playground of relation in the set of the west The 'Bouncy' Panda has been damaged due to use by children who are too large/heavy.Bawdeswell Garage are repairing it. Finance

THE GREATEST GIFT

Mary is 24 years old and a Secretary, Brian is 55 and an Accountant, Angela is 35 and a homemaker, Richard is 19 and a student. They all have one special thing in common with 450 others who live in and around Reepham - all are registered blood donors.

These exceptional people are modest about their priceless contribution - the gift of life itself for many sick people. Typical comments from Reepham donors: "It is nice to know that I am really helping someone". "A friend of mine was in a serious accident and wouldn't have survived if it hadn't been for blood donors - I come to the session because of that". "Until you become a blood donor you just don't realise how vital your 'pint' is. Giving up an hour twice a year to donate is so little compared to the enormous good that it does".

Blood donors are always needed, since there is a constant and increasing demand from our hospitals as medical science finds new ways to use blood for more and more therapeutic products which help to prevent and cure illness, as well as saving lives.

In the last year the East Anglian Blood Transfusion Service has been seeking ways to improve its services, both for patients and donors. Two innovations have been the introduction of new technology, and the launch of a mobile Session Team based in Norwich to cover the Eastern and coastal area of the region.

These activities combined have resulted in extensive changes to the annual programme of visits in the region, causing alteration to dates, days and times of many donor sessions, including those held in Reepham. We expect, however, that when these changes have been fully implemented, our Service will not only be more efficient, which will be to the benefit of patients, but will also satisfy the requirements of a significant majority of donors.
