

#### Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting held on 1st November 1993

New Councillor

Bill Cunliffe was co-opted as a new Parish Councillor.

**Matters Arising** 

-Councillor Wright will arrange for the concrete tube on the recreation ground to be removed.

-The response to the recent Housing Survey had been encouraging. The replies will be analysed by Breckland Department.

Clerk's Report

-Bawdeswell Garage are considering selling cars and will need to erecr a fence at the front of the forecourt. As a result that it should be relocated next to the Village Hall, on the set aside for Phase 2.

-In the Best Kept Village Competition Bawdeswell came 7th out of their group (of 8) this year. Last year their position was 3rd out of 8, but the Judges' comments this year are very complimentary and standards overall have risen, so we shall just have to try harder next year!! The results are posted on the notice board outside Folland Court.

Planning Issues

-After appeal to the Planning Inspectorate, Planning Permission has been given for some changes to Phase 3 of Hall Road. This means that 7 of the larger houses will be replaced by 12 smaller houses, so the total

number will increase by 5.

-Bawdeswell Garden Centre wish to erect another propagation greenhouse. While a successful local business is good for the local economy, the Council were concerned about the increase in overspill parking and traffic around the junction with the main road and the need for effective screen planting around the Garden Centre.

-Breckland Planning are insisting that there is more hedging and tree planting around the Village Hall. The Clerk will meet their

representative on site to discuss the proposals.

-There was some discussion about the proposal to use the School House (next to Bawdeswell School) as a Tutorial Centre for staff from the Education Department to work with children who are having difficulties at Schools in the mid Norfolk area. Five staff would have offices there but mostly working off site. There are no proposals to involve Bawdeswell School. It was agreed to support the planning application.

Playground Report

The new equipment is now installed. Councillor Farthing had received four complaints about dog mess on this area. These will be discussed when the dog warden attends the December meeting.

Any other business

A -The Highways Department will be asked to attend to the hole in the road at the junction of Hall Road and Norwich Road and the ponding problem outside the school (again!).

The next meeting is on Monday 6th December at 7.30pm

in the Village Hall.

Minutes of the previous meeting were taken as read and signed.
The meeting was opened by Vice Chairman Mr C Skinner.
Planning - Bawdeswell Farms - planning permission granted for road across fields at Beck Hall Farm on Billingford Road, Foxley.
Davis Egg Sales - permission granted for general purpose portable storage building at Moor Farm. Application received re: Anglian Water Services to ascertain whether replacement building for housing electrical equipment requires planning permission at STW Norwich Road.

War memorial rededication - Clerk reported arrangements had been made for this to take place Sunday 14th November 1993 10.45am. The rector has agreed and the Swanton Morley Boy Scouts will be in attendance. Clerk to arrange to purchase a wreath.

Bus shelter - an estimate has been received for repairing this at a cost of £39.80. This was unanimously agreed by Councillors for this work to be carried out.

A parishioner brought to the council's attention of a leakage of water near Cranfield House. Clerk to write to Anglian Water.

Very many complaints have been received re mud and filth on Themelthorpe Road again. Clerk to get in touch with Norfolk County Council, and also re loose chippings at the entrance to Mill Road and on Old Fakenham Road.

Resignation of Clerk was received with regret - see advertisement under separate entry.

Come and see the old year out at the village hall; dancing is to 'Andy and the Critical Zone' and 'Mr Blobbie'.




'Bawdeswell beat Norwich Avenue First School, Mulbarton A and Mulbarton B to claim the trophy.'
