This year, as in the last few years, we are invited to join together for worship throughout Lent and a deanery basis. Both Bawdeswell and Foxley are just one of seven groups of parishes which form the Sparham Deanery. Each group of parishes takes responsibility for one of the services on the six Sundays in Lent plus a deanery Holy Communion service on Ash Wednesday. One of the strengths of this yearly undertaking is that it brings together christians from quite a wide area to worship with each other and to share together in their common faith in Christ. Each service ends with a welcome 'cuppa' usually at the back of church and people are often still chatting nearly an hour after the final hymn has died away. Instead of meeting with just a handfull of fellow worshippers in their own church a deanery congregation of sometimes 70 or 80 will have been encouraged in each others company. The Lent service in our own parishes isn't until Palm Sunday 4th April (6.30 p.m. at Foxley) but before then there will have been opportunities to visit Guist (on Ash Wednesday) along with sunday evening visits to Wood Dalling, Lyng, Hindolveston, Swannington, and Weston Longville. DIGEST OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 7th DECEMBER 1992

Parish precept/Council Tax

The Breckland Council deadline for 1993/4 was due before Christmas so an urgent decision was needed on the Parish requirements for next year.Although all Councillors were concerned about an increase in the current economic climate, the Council have to meet the cost of the loan for the construction of the road to the Village Hall.It was decided that the minimum amount needed for 1993/4 is f4000 to allow debt charges to be met. (This compares to a precept of f3000 in 1992/3).The Council reviews this amount every year and reconsider the budget at the end of 1993 to see whether the cost to the Parish can be reduced.

A copy of the charge bands for the new Council Tax will be posted on the Notice Boards and the full list of addresses and their coding will be kept at the Village Store for inspection until individual bills are sent .

New signs

Signs have been requested to give directions to the Village Hall and Playground and to remind dog owners not to exercise their dogs on the Recreation Ground.

Planning permission has been given for a farm shop and saddlery at Park Farm, Dereham Road.

Village Hall

Now that the money has been obtained only the weather is holding up the completion of the road so that the Hall can be opened.A management committee is to be set up and more villagers are urgently needed to help run the building and activities.A meeting will be arranged shortly.

The Highway Department will be reminded that the footpath to the Hall is now needed urgently. There has been some vandalism to the building, all villagers are requested to keep their eyes and ears open to prevent futher damage and report culprits.

Playground

All the equipment from this years budget is now in and paid for.Shell UK are considering a grant for fencing.Breckland Council have inspected the site and recommended the removal of the concrete 'tunnnel'.This was regrettable but essential cn safety grounds.

Footpaths Footpaths

There are grants and advice available from the Countryside Commision to maintain and develop foot -paths.A walk along all the paths in the Parish is to be arranged for Spring/Eastertime -for pleasure and also to check their condition.A route and further details will be publicised next month.

Highway Repairs

Reinstatement of the 'cats eyes'on local roads and repairs to the stile onto the by-pass at the end of the Billingford Road -will be requested from Breckland.

Low cost housing Details of surveys and information to judge the local need for this will be discussed at the next meeting in February.

Present: Clldr. T Parnell-Cook,(Chairman) P Davis, Mrs H Parnell-Cook, Mrs G Saker, and Clerk, and Five Parishioners.

Apologies: for absence Mr C Skinner and Mr D Sayer BDC Representative.

Silver Jubilee Sign: Clerk received letter from B.D.C stating they noted the sign had been removed, but no reply has been received from them, in response to the request, to think again about their decision.

Complaints re speeding through street, Chairman and other members of the council had a meeting with Mr Bushell N.C.C. Highways, various ideas were discussed but if a 30mph sign were erected this would cost the Parish Council £200.00, also suggested rumble strips but this would create noise for the residents, or a 'Please Drive Slowly' sign erected near church(Clerk to find out cost of this). Mr Bushell suggested 'SLOW' painted on the road at entrance of street, off the A1067 Clerk to write requesting this.

Drain in Foxley Street cleared, but parishioners reported two more need attention. (Clerk to write).

Mr Bushell NCC was very concerned at the state of road and verges on Themelthorpe Road, he will look into this matter more fully. Mr Davis said there was nothing he could do about this, he could not make a walkway for his cows as he had to use this land as part of a new 'set a side' law being adopted by the government.

War memorial: Mr Simpson, Scout Leader for 1st Swanton Morley Scouts, attended the meeting to report progress and gave an outline of cost, this was approx. £200.00, unanimously agreed to go ahead with this, also it was agreed there would be a wreath laid each year at Armistice Sunday.

Clerk to write to Norfolk Naturalist Trust asking if possible to have an entrance to the Foxley Wood off the Bl145 road, as the volume of traffic through the Street has increased considerably since this had been opened to the public.




