

Dear Friends



DIGEST OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 7th JUNE 1993

Present-Councillors Battley(Chairman), Sparkes, Duncan, Wright and Harroven and 3 parishioners.

Apologies-Councillors Farthing and Strickland.

Clerks Report

-It was agreed that Mr Welsby could now take over responsibility for maintaining Adams'Pit and the Old Surveyors land.

-Cheques agreed included a donation of £25 to the South Norfolk Victim Support Scheme and the 1st intstallment of the loan to build the road to the Village Hall in the sum if £1,102.73.

-Recycled glass from the Bottle Bank earnt the Village a refund of £31.05 last year. The previous years' refund was only £9.60, so this was welcome news.

Planning

Planning permission has been refused for part of Phase 3 of Rogers' Development off Hall Road. The grounds for the refusal concluded that it would "...result in a cramped and unsatisfactory form of development likely to create conditions detrimental to the character of the area."

RECREATION REPORT

Mr Sparkes has been appointed as the new Treasurer for the Village Hall Committee. It is hoped that the 200 Club draw can recommence shortly.

PLAY AREA

-Councillor Harroven was concerned about the concrete tube. Councillor Wright offered to partly bury it to make a mound. It was agreed to await advice from RoSPA when they make their annual inspection.

-Breckland D.C. have agreed another grant of £500 towards new play equipment. Another grant application will be made to Norfolk Playing Fields Association and if successfull the Council will then consider its own contibution and choice of equipment.

ANY OTHER BUISNESS

-Bawdeswell Heath Trustees have now met with a representative from the Countryside Commission who are formulating a 10 year management plan with an annual grant to cover the cost of upkeep. -Highways will be asked to re-instate the 30 mph sign by the Garden Centre, to move the 'road narrows' sign, which overhangs the new pavement along the Reepham Road and to supply a viewing mirror and 'concealed entrance' sign on the bend by Chapel Cottages.

-The Chairman had had a complaint about noise from the Youth Club disco, which has been passed to the Youth Club Organisers.
