



This was the Annual General Meeting in addition to the usual, monthly meeting.

The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming those present.He thanked the Clerks,Mrs Curson and Mrs Bramley for their work during the year and said how much he had enjoyed working for the village,particularly in a year which had seen the long awaited opening of the Village Hall.

Councillor Battley was re-elected Chairman and Councillor Farthing was re-elected Vice-Chairman. <u>Clerks' Report</u>

As the books are being prepared for audit there was a brief summary of the Councils' financial situation which showed that there will be no problem in meeting the loan repayment on the Village Hall road.

10 Planning applications received.

Planning application

Received for the erection of a garage on Plot 1 of the Old Bowling Green development(now to be called 'Old Woods Green').No objections. Parish Heritage Register Breckland D.C. had written to say that they can no longer keep these registers and maps up to date.The Clerk will check whether the Parish Council can take over this responsibility and/or

retain the map for display in the Village Hall. (The map is currently on the wall next to the Post Office).

Village Sign Seat

The Clerk was instructed to arrange for the seat which has been partially uprooted to be repositioned as soon as possible.

The Old Toll House

Gressenhall Museum are to be asked whether they have any knowledge of its history or interest in its preservation.

1. The Committee are preparing a 10 year Conservation Plan, and are hoping to have the Heath 'adopted' by the Countryside Commission who would help with funds and labour.

2.It was agreed that the fingerpost on the Dereham Road entrance should be removed as it shows a bridleway going across the Heath.This is only a footpath,anyone wishing to take a horse across this route may only do so with the express agreement of the Heath Committee and after paying an annual fee.

3.Councillor Sparkes was elected as the new Parish Council representative on this committee. Playground report

-RoSPA will be carrying out an annual inspection and advising on any safety or maintenance issues. Adams' Pit and the Old Surveyors Land

There was concern about the neglect of hedges and ditches around the Surveyors' Land and the condition of Adams' Pit.The Clerk will check and report on progress at the next meeting.

Recreation Report

The Secretary has resigned, so there will be an election at the next meeting. There was concern over the lack of local support for the Cabaret Night.A Sixties Night will be the next major event so it is hoped more villagers will turn out. The Youth Club and regular Step-Aerobics sessions are proving successful.
